CITY OF SAN JOSE'S REPORT OF CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS AND EXPENDITURES FOR THE NOVEMBER 8, 2016 GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION

The following press release has been prepared for the November 8, 2016 General Municipal Election pursuant to San José Municipal Code Section 12.06.920 and is intended to notify the public of the total amount of contributions and expenditures made by candidate and candidate controlled committees.
