

NEIGHBORHOOD ADVISORY GROUP: SETTING UP A GOVERNING STRUCTURE

ISSUE #1: How should voting be conducted?

PROPOSAL for consideration (to modify, reject, or accept in March):

1. Every neighborhood association + Ann Darling receives 1 vote (*)
2. Multi-neighborhood SNI NAC's (13th Street, Washington, Five Wounds-Brookwood Terrace, University) also receive one vote (*)
3. "Voting by proxy" permitted by email or signed proxy of neighborhood president or designated NAG representative

Consider also:

- 1) *Northside, the largest neighborhood, has about 20,000 residents, spanning dozens of blocks. West of Fourth covers about 2 ½ blocks. Should we somehow account for these disparities in population?*
- 2) *Some neighborhoods currently lack associations (e.g., South Berryessa, Rancho Verde), and we will need to include them if/when they become organized.*

ISSUE #2: What should group hierarchy resemble?

PROPOSAL for consideration (to modify, reject, or accept in March):

- Chair
- Vice-Chair
- 3 Board Members (one for each identified NAG priority)

ISSUE #3: "3 For D3": What issues should NAG identify as critical district-wide priorities for the next 12 months?

- Historic preservation in neighborhoods
- Park Maintenance/ Volunteer Participation
