1. Welcome, Introductions and Adoption of the October 22, 2010 Policy Team Minutes

Mayor Chuck Reed began the meeting at 7:35 am with members of the Task Force and public introducing themselves.

Upon a motion by District Attorney Dolores Carr and Seconded by Jeff Bornefeld the Task Force passed the adoption of the October 22, 2010 minutes unanimously.

2. Climate Discussion

Chief Moore commented on the low gang homicide rates that the City of San Jose has seen in 2010 and acknowledged the good response of emergency workers in saving lives. Lt. John Spicer reported that overall gang crime and activity is down in San Jose for 2010. This includes violent, non-violent and gang related homicides.

3. County Jails Climate report

Nelly Davis reported on behalf of the sheriffs department regarding gang crime and activity through out Santa Clara County. The Task Force discussed in depth the relationship between gang activity in the Jails and its effects on the streets.

4. Subcommittee Updates

Councilmember Madison Nguyen reported on behalf of the community engagement subcommittee. The committee continues to work with the faith

community to foster a functional working partnership. Additionally Councilmember Nguyen invited the Task Force to attend the third annual crime and gang prevention summit on Saturday January 22, 2011. Council member Nguyen also praised the district 7 youth advisory council for winning a national award for their PSA “ignorance isn’t bliss”.

Mario Maciel reported on behalf of the Inter-agency subcommittee. The subcommittee is actively working to complete the 2011 work plan.

Jeff Bornefeld reported on behalf of the Technical Team subcommittee. The Technical Team has selected new members to represent them since the October policy team meeting. Additionally members of the technical team raised concerns about funding for the next fiscal year.

John Porter Jr., Superintendent of Franklin McKinley School District, reported on behalf of the City School Collaborative.

5. MGPTF strategic plan report updates (Mario Maciel)

Mario Maciel, superintendent of the Mayor's gang prevention task force, updated the policy team on the 2008-2011 MGPTF strategic work plan. The update date covered work that the Task Force has currently completed such as: the 2010 Safe Summer Initiative; developing work plans for all subcommittees; continuing to partner regionally, state and nationally. Additionally Mr. Maciel reported on the decrease in gang violence in San Jose over the past year and highlighted next steps.

6. SNI business plan update (Norberto Duenas/ Kip Harkness)

Kip Harkness reported on the SNI business work plan. The updated business plan reflects the updated priorities of the Mayor and City Council and concentrates limited resources into key areas to maximize results.
