1. Welcome, Introductions and Adoption of the June 25, 2010 Policy Team Minutes

Mayor Chuck Reed began the meeting at 7:30 am with members of the Task Force and public introducing themselves. Mayor Reed welcomed the City of San Pablo to the MGPTF Policy Team meeting.

Mayor Reed asked that the agenda be amended to let the City Manager present on the police chief's recruitment efforts first. Request was approved unanimously.

1. Police Chief Recruitment

Debra Figone, San Jose City Manager, presented on the efforts that the city is taking to outreach to the community in regards to the police chief's recruitment.

Susie Rivera, Technical Team lead, reported on behalf of the MGPTF Technical team subcommittee. The Technical team is working on finalizing the new work plan. Additionally the subcommittee is in the process of selecting new Teach Team leads for the new year.

John Porter Jr., Superintendent of Franklin McKinley School District, reported on behalf of the City School Collaborative.

4. MARC Update

Chief Mitchell presented to the Task Force updates regarding the MARC. One issue that has been identified by the inter-agency subcommittee as a problem facing the MARC is transportation. PD and Probation will be working further to increase the MARC use.

5. Alternative Schools Update

Cary Dritz, Santa Clara County Office of Education, presented to the Task Force work around the alternative schools.
