1. Welcome, Introductions and Adoption of the August 27, 2010 Policy Team Minutes

Mayor Chuck Reed began the meeting at 7:35 am with members of the Task Force and public introducing themselves.

Upon a motion by CM Nguyen and second by District Attorney Dolores Carr the Task Force unanimously passed the adoption of the August 27, 2010 minutes unanimously.

2. Climate Discussion

Lt. John Spicer provided the gang climate report on behalf of the SJPD.

3. Subcommittee Updates

Councilmember Madison Nguyen reported on behalf of the community engagement subcommittee. The subcommittee is currently working on the 2011 crime and gang prevention summit, in addition to efforts being taken to distribute the Anti-Gang PSA developed by the youth commission.

Mario Maciel reported on behalf of the Inter-agency subcommittee, in lieu of Angel Rios and supervisor George Shirakawa Jr.

Jeff Bornefeld, Technical Team lead, reported on behalf of the MGPTF Technical team subcommittee. The teach team division asked for the MGPTF policy team position on Prop.19, legalizing marijuana. Khoa Nguyen, Mayor's Policy aide, advised the body that the Mayor's Gang Prevention Task Force serves as an advisory body to the Mayor and does not take a position on political issues. However, the Task Force may advise the Mayor on the issues, which the Mayor may bring back to the entire city council for full consideration.

John Porter Jr., Superintendent of Franklin McKinley School District, reported on behalf of the City School Collaborative.

1. Washington D.C Visit

Jose Salcido, Mayor's senior policy advisor, reported to the Task Force about the City of San Jose delegations' visit to Washington D.C. The visit promotes a closer working partnership with federal agencies around forming a national model to deal with gang issues.

4. Subcommittee Work Plans

Khoa Nguyen, Mayor's Policy Aide, updated the Task Force on the progress of the work plans from each subcommittee. By February 2011 all the work plans will be completed. Additionally by the Dec. 2011 policy team meeting there will be a report on the progress of each subcommittee's work plan.

5. Safe Summer Initiative

Mario Maciel, Superintendent of the Mayor's Gang Prevention Task Force, presented to the Policy Team the final report for the Safe Summer Initiative Grant for 2010. Even with decreased funding there has been a continual decrease in gang activity through out the summer months. Mayor Reed committed to finding funding for the 2011 safe summer initiative.
