

## **PROJECT: Five Wounds/Brookwood Terrace — Rail to Trail**

### **General Description:**

The Five Wounds/Brookwood Terrace — Rail to Trail project is located within the planned Alum Rock BART Station that includes housing, locally-run shops, restaurants, entertainment and a neighborhood center. This rail to trail project will construct a new pedestrian and bicycle trail to connect the north and south residential neighborhoods. It will complement a revitalized East Santa Clara Street/Alum Rock Avenue corridor connecting the east and west neighborhoods.

This rail to trail corridor is approximately 1.5 miles long (40 foot average width) and extends from Highway 101 on the north to East William Street on the south. The corridor which is located within an inactive railroad right-of-way and owned by the Valley Transportation Authority and bisects a highly urbanized area. The corridor also intersects several local neighborhood streets that includes East William Street and East Santa Clara Street.

This rail to trail project will construct separate pedestrian and bicycle trails except in areas where the trail intersects landscaping areas, active recreational facilities such as exercise stations and playground areas and passive recreational facilities such as seating areas and interpretive signage. The project will also construct three trail gateway structures that will incorporate public art works and lighting.

The project design has not yet been implemented.

**Cost:** \$ 5.5 M Construction (Estimate) Granting funding is proposed for both design and construction costs.
