

PROJECT: MINIDOKA AVENUE SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENT

General Description: In November 2007 staff submitted a grant application for the State-Legislated Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program for sidewalk construction along Minidoka Avenue. Caltrans notified the City in July 2008 regarding the approved project list for Cycle 2 of the SRTS program and the Minidoka Avenue Sidewalk Improvement Project (map attached) is qualified to receive \$746,000 in funding.

Minidoka Avenue is a two-lane collector street in East San Jose and is a walking route to Russo Academy, McEntee Academy, Pala Middle School, and James Lick High School. The primary goal of this project is to reduce pedestrian related accidents and to have a safe walking/bicycling route to the surrounding schools.

The pedestrian-oriented improvements will include installation of sidewalk, curb and gutter, ADA compliant curb ramps, crosswalk, asphalt concrete paving, street trees, streetlights and storm drainage facilities along the school walking route.

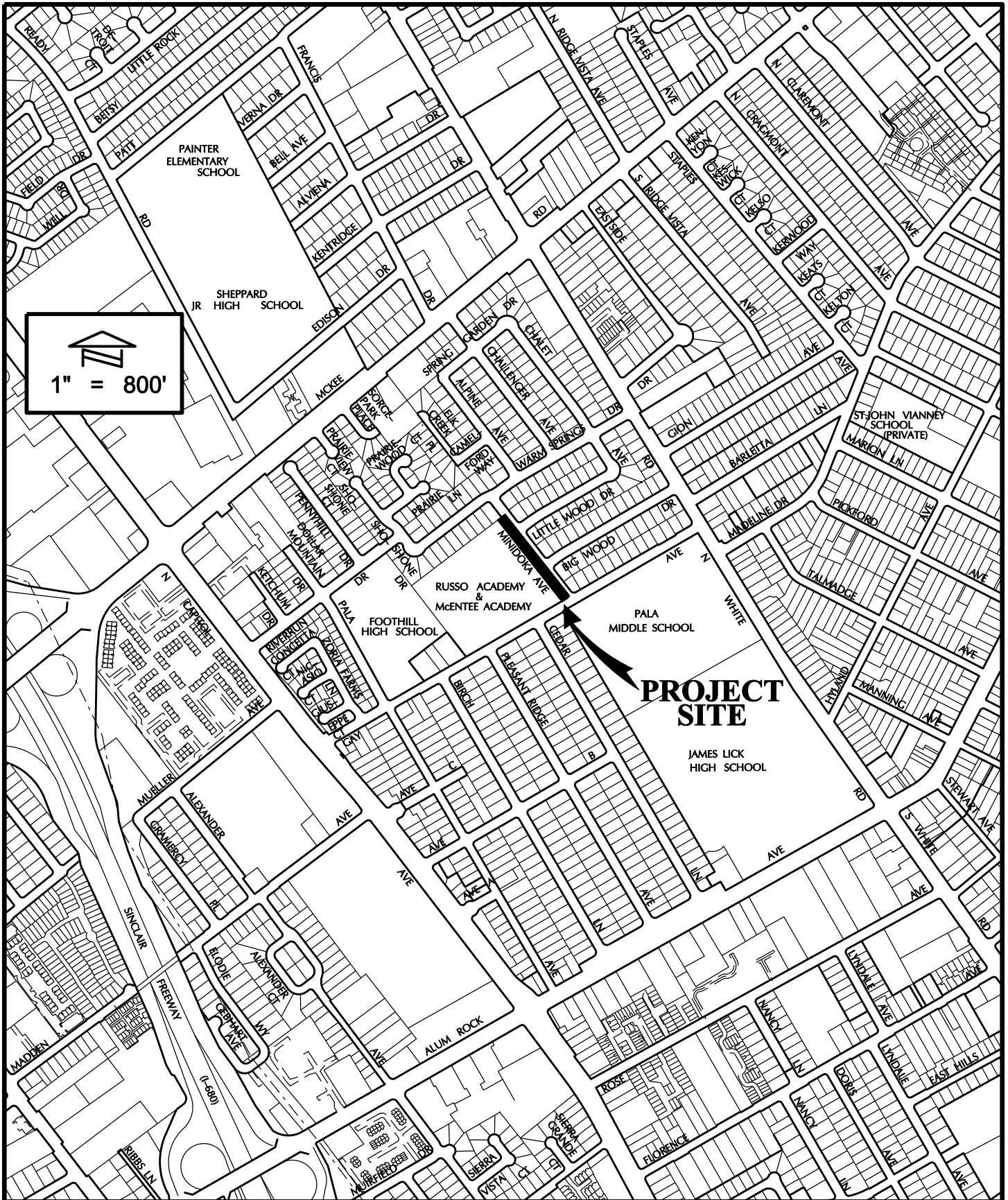
