

PROJECT: MINIDOKA AVENUE SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENT

General Description:

In November 2007, staff submitted grant application for the State-Legislated SRTS program for sidewalk construction along Minidoka Avenue and in July 2008, Caltrans notified the City about the approved project list for Cycle 2 of the Federal Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Program. The Minidoka Avenue Sidewalk Improvement Project (map attached) is qualified to receive \$746,000 in SRTS funding.

Minidoka Avenue is a two-lane collector street in East San Jose and is walking route to Russo Academy, McEntee Academy, Pala Middle School, and James Lick High School. The primary goal of this project is to reduce injuries and fatalities to school children, parents and to have a safe walking and bicycling route to the surrounding schools.

The pedestrian-oriented improvements will include installation of sidewalk, curb and gutter, ADA compliant curb ramps, crosswalk, asphalt concrete paving, street trees, streetlights and storm drainage facilities along the school walking route.

Cost: \$537,000 Construction (Estimate)

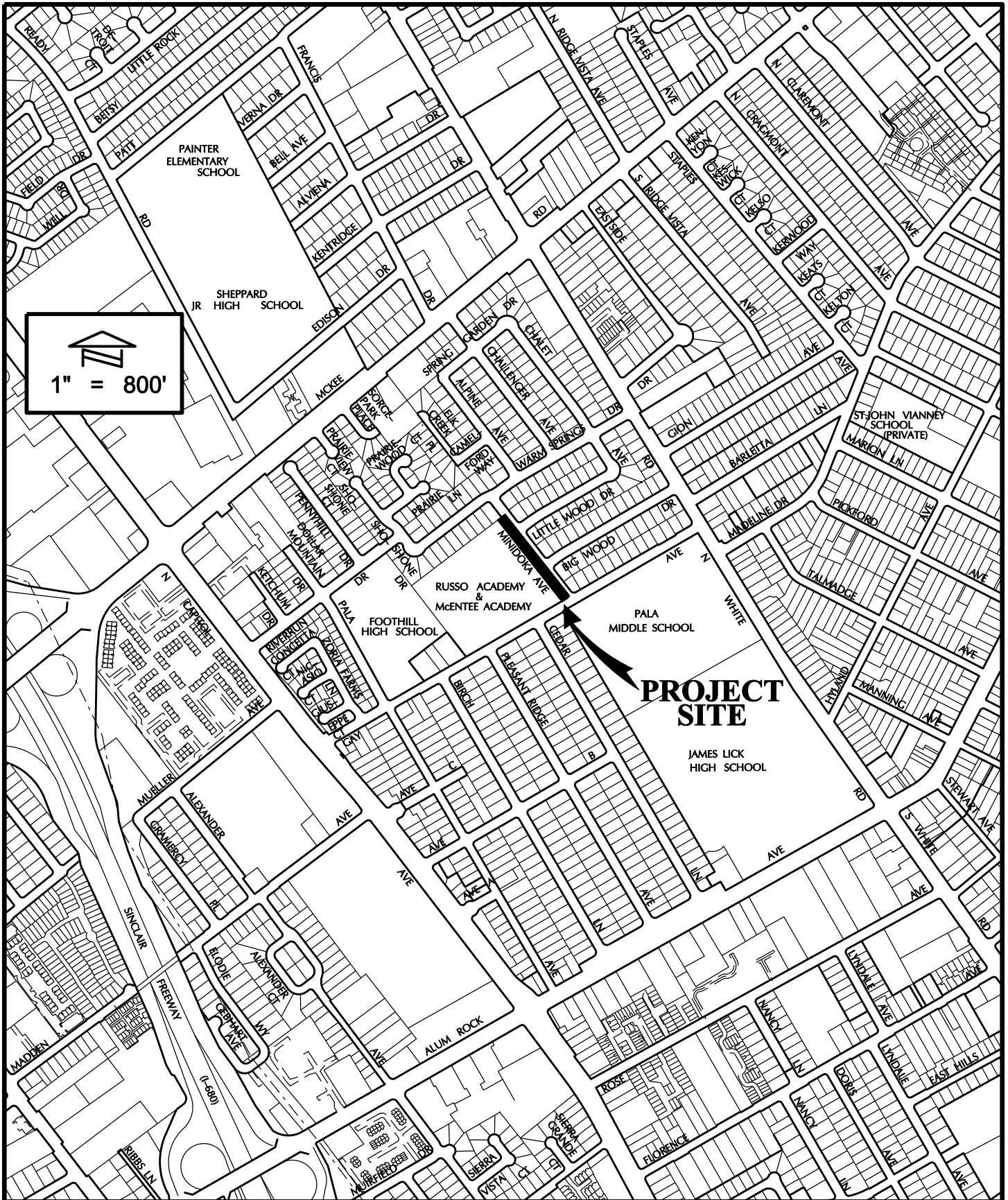

- 950 lf of curb and gutter
- 9 each ADA compliant curb ramps
- 17 each new street trees (Saratoga specie)
- 4 each new LED street lights
- 4 each upgrade to LED street lights
- Traffic stripes and pavement markings
- 420 tons of asphalt pavement
