

Three Creeks Trail Master Plan  
**Meeting Summary – Workshop 1**  
March 19, 2013

Approximately seventy community members attended the first of three workshops on the Master Plan for the Three Creeks Trail. Held on Tuesday, March 19th at the Willow Glen Community Center, the purpose of the workshop was to gather data from the community to help create a comprehensive master plan for trail development. The master plan is for the approximately one mile long western alignment of the trail on the old railroad right-of-way that runs from Lonus Street to the Guadalupe River at Falcon Place. This portion of the trail is ready for development as it has been purchased from the railroad and the site has been certified as clean.



The workshop started with a brief presentation District 6 City Councilmember Pierluigi Oliverio led off the meeting by explaining the City's role in the purchase and management. Using the attached PowerPoint, Trail Manager Yves Zsutty from the City of San José's Department of Parks, Recreation, & Neighborhood Services described the scope, level of detail and quality that the City hopes to achieve on the trail. Yves also described San Jose's trail network, the importance of this trail in the network, and the overriding goals of the trail system for innovation, quality and access. Yves then gave a brief presentation on the history of the project. Cordy Hill from the RHAA Landscape Architects then described the workshop process of community members moving to stations to give individual feedback on such topics as opportunities, desired amenities, issues.

The community offered numerous suggestions in a variety of topics ranging from trail design, intersection treatments, desired amenities to historical themes. Please see attached for a summary of the comments received.

The design team will take the input and develop three alternatives for public review and comment at the next community meeting. The second community meeting will take place on Wednesday, May 29 at 6:30pm at the same location, and a third for review of the proposed preferred plan will be held July 24.
