The building at 995 Elizabeth St. is an irregular plan, wood frame, gable and flat roof building that currently serves as the Marina restaurant and lounge. The buildings north (primary) the side is marked by a wraparound enclosed addition that extends from the front face of the building. This addition is enclosed with a mixture of concrete block, Windows, and stucco walls. A modern plane railing ballast tops the addition to give it the appearance of the balcony. All windows on the building are modern vinyl sliding windows. A one-story flat roof addition is located along the west side of the building. The front facing shallow gable roof has box eaves and exposed rafters. It is located immediately west of the railroad right of way and is surrounded by a paved surface parking lot.

## **History**

The building at 995 Elizabeth Street was originally constructed sometime before 1908 as a Queen Anne-style inn known as the Alviso Hotel. At that time it shared a lot with the railroad depot. By 1930 the hotel had been expanded with a two-story rectangular plan addition on the north side of the building. Between 1965 and 1968, the corner tower that marked the main entrance to the hotel was removed, the northeast corner of the building was made square and the original gable and hip roof was replaced with the current low pitch gable roof. This dramatically altered the appearance of the building. It is likely that the current flat roof surrounding porch was also added at this time, replacing the original porch that wrapped from the northwestern corner around to the front third of the eastern façade.

## **Status**

The Alviso Hotel has changed considerably since it was first constructed. As such, the building is not listed as a contributing feature to the 1972 Port of Alviso National Register District.<sup>4</sup> It is included in the application for the *Port of Alviso California Point of Historical Interest* because "the Alviso Hotel acknowledges the role of Alviso as a major 'shipping depot' and trade center from the 1850's to the early 1900's." While discussed, it is considered non-contributing to the Port of Alviso historic district due to its lack of integrity.
