*P3a. Description: (Describe resource and its major elements. Include design, materials, condition, alterations, size, setting, and boundaries)

The single-family residence at 1413 El Dorado Street is a one-story, square plan, wood frame, Queen Anne building with a hipped, rolled asphalt roof and large north-facing dormer. It is located on a large corner lot at the southeast corner of Catherine and El Dorado streets. Clad in wood shiplap and drop channel siding, the west (primary) elevation features a projecting, front-facing gabled window bay. A wraparound porch extends from the wood panel front door to the far end of the north (secondary) elevation facing Catherine Street. The porch features turned columns with paired brackets that support a ball-and-spindle frieze. Larger ball-and-spindle elements comprise the porch and stair balustrade.

A one-story, wood frame, rectangular plan carriage house/barn/garage building is located along the eastern property line. This structure has a centrally located cupola on the front (west)-facing gable roof. A single, mature palm tree is located at the northwest corner of the property. Most of the rest of the L-shaped, 0.29 acre lot is vacant. See Continuation Sheet.

P3a: Description (Continued)

History

Built in 1902, this house was a central part of 20th century civic life in Alviso. It was the longtime home of Alice and Fred Huxham. Alice was the daughter of Miles Hollister who once operated a store across Catherine Street. Alice served as Alviso's "police judge," one of several local women to hold the position. The barn behind the house was once larger than it appears today; a small shed next to the palm tree served as the Alviso Post Office for many years and was also the location of a branch of the Santa Clara Free Library.²

Status

The building is a contributing feature to the 1972 Port of Alviso National Register District and is included in the 1995 *Port of Alviso, California Point of Historical Interest*.^{3,4}
