*P3a. Description: (Describe resource and its major elements. Include design, materials, condition, alterations, size, setting, and boundaries)

The Wade Residence is a one-and-a-half story, rectangular plan, wood frame building located near the north property line of a lot shared with the Wade Warehouse. It has a front gable roof with a centrally located door and gable-end window on the west (primary) facade. Two windows flank the front door. Additional fenestration is visible on the north and south facades. The building is clad in drop channel siding on the west façade and lap siding on the north and south facades. A combination of vertical and horizonal wood board siding clads the east (rear) elevation. A wide frieze panel composed of built-up profiled trim defines the gable and boxed eaves. The roof is clad in wood shingles. All door and window openings are covered by plywood. A single metal stove pipe extends from the northeast corner of the building.

History

"A pioneer of 1849, Harry Wade, Sr. brought his family to Alviso in 1851, where he established a teaming business and operated a hotel. It is not clear whether this house was the original prefabricated structure brought in 1851 or another one 'brought 'round the Horn in 1855,' as reported by his granddaughter. The house was occupied by Harry Wade Jr. until he went to San Jose to live with his daughter in 1908. During his absence, he rented an adjacent warehouse.

A comparison of photographs show that the building once had a full width, shed roof front porch across the west elevation that was installed sometime between the 1950s and 1972.^{1,2} A shed-roof enclosure was also located at the rear (east) of the building at least as early as 1928. Both the porch and the rear addition were removed sometime before 2002.³ The building was used as a residence at least through 1972. It is currently vacant and all windows and doors are boarded. In spite of its dilapidated condition, the structure, in association with the Wade warehouse, makes and important contribution to the Port of Alviso and the Historic District listed on the National Register of Historic Places."⁴

Status

The building is a contributing feature to the 1973 Port of Alviso National Register District and is included in the 1995 *Port of Alviso. California Point of Historical Interest.*^{5,6}
