INFORMATION

Following are the key activities to be highlighted this week:

Tuesday Market at San José City Hall — Starting April 21 and continuing through September 1, 2009, there will be a new farmers' market every Tuesday behind City Hall (located on Fifth and San Fernando Streets), from 3:00 – 7:30 p.m. The Tuesday Market at City Hall will feature locally grown produce, unique collectible arts and crafts, and resource booths on how to live a "greener" lifestyle by becoming energy efficient, reducing waste, conserving water and preventing pollution. To help celebrate the start of the market, the Somos Mayfair community theatre ensemble will provide a street theater performance featuring giant colorful puppets to illuminate the ecological crisis and action everyone can take to preserve the environment and secure our health. Green IT — The City recently received a PG&E rebate of nearly \$25,000 as a result of the cooperative efforts of the Information Technolgy Department (ITD), the Environmental Services Department (ESD), and the Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) to reduce energy consumption through the installation of power-saving software on desktop computers. Preliminary results from a small sample group indicate potential annual energy savings per computer of 50 kWh each year, and greenhouse gas emission reductions of 68 pounds per computer each year. Based on the City's 6,000 personal computer (PC) count, ITD estimates annual energy cost savings of up to \$30,000.

Airport Passenger Activity Drops nearly 23% in March —The preliminary March 2009 passenger traffic report at Mineta International Airport (SJC), showed a drop of 22.7% compared to March 2008, the largest single month decline since September 11, 2001. The rate of decline has continued to accelerate over the past six months as a consequence of severe economic recession affecting business and personal travel. Airlines continue to reduce system capacity for both domestic and international service, and the industry as a whole is forecasting at least a \$6 billion loss in 2009. Airports across the country are reporting serious declines in traffic and in revenues. In February, Oakland Airport reported a 31.4% and San Francisco International a 9.4% drop in passengers. SJC estimates that traffic for FY 2008-09 will be down about 15% compared to last fiscal year, which directly reduces revenues that support Airport operations and capital programs. New Pilot Blight Reduction Program —In May 2009, the City will launch a pilot program in the Hoffman/Via Monte neighborhood aimed at reducing illegal dumping. The City will charge Hoffman/Via Monte multi-family property owners a one-time large item collection fee of \$55.50 on their May garbage bill to create a fund that will be used to pay the City's contracted solid waste hauler to patrol and collect illegally dumped large items. This program will be run as a one-year pilot. Blight has been a problem in this neighborhood for several years and the Neighborhood Action Coalition (NAC) has worked with the City to increase Code Enforcement patrols and plan neighborhood cleanup events. These efforts have reduced large item dumping in the community, but it continues to be a major problem. In response, an interdepartmental group composed of representatives from ESD, Code Enforcement, Redevelopment Agency and Council District 10 developed this innovative approach to reducing blight. The program was designed to share the cost equally among all property owners. Property owners were notified about the program in a letter on March 26, and they have all been invited to attend public meetings about the program on April 16. Many property owners have expressed support for the program because it proactively removes large items at a low cost, while reducing blight and code enforcement citations. City Collaboration Honored for Supporting Youth —On March 19, CommUniverCity received the Community Values Youth Award from Project Cornerstone. CommUniverCity, a partnership with the City, the Redevelopment Agency and San José State University (SJSU), was honored for helping the Five Wounds/Brookwood Terrace community achieve two of its priorities: creating a college-going culture for neighborhood youth and providing opportunities for youth to interact with positive adult role models. Since its inception in 2005, CommUniverCity has engaged more than 10,000 neighborhood residents and nearly 2,800 SJSU students in more than 65 neighborhood projects in the Strong Neighborhoods Initiative Area northeast of downtown. Projects included:

- Providing a safe space for gang-impacted teens to interact with adult mentors during the evening;
- Hands-on science activities in three elementary schools;
- Science projects for 168 elementary school students and their parents; and a
- Community Halloween celebration for more than 1,800 children.

Project Cornerstone brings together families, schools, community centers, faith communities and businesses to support and guide local youth. For more information, visit www.communiversitysanjose.org and www.projectcornerstone.org.
