INFORMATION

Following are the key activities to be highlighted this week:

Japanese Friendship Garden Suffers Loss of Koi—Over the past two weeks an unusually high number of the Koi fish in the Japanese Friendship Garden at Kelley Park have died. A total of 112 fish have died or been euthanized since Saturday, April 11, 2009. Staff have collected and sent biological samples to a lab for analysis with results due early next week. They are actively monitoring the remaining population, examining fish for external parasites, collecting and shipping more biological samples for laboratory examination and analysis, increased capacity the oxygen levels in the ponds and have aggressively worked to physically remove algae buildup. Staff has coordinated their activities with contract fish biologist Andy Case and have been in contact with the Monterey Bay Aquarium. The fish have been under added stress due to a number of concurrent circumstances, including pond design (not originally designed for fish), annual spawning, and unexpected onset of record high temperatures leading to algae blooms. Gateway to Higher Learning —On April 14, Human Resources hosted the City's first Annual Education Fair and Recognition Event where 56 employees were honored for their outstanding academic achievements in the last two years. The event celebrated City employees from various departments that obtained degrees and advanced learning certificates while serving the City and its residents, including 11 professional certificates/licenses, 25 Bachelor's Degrees, 18 Master's Degrees and two Juris Doctorate Degrees. The celebratory event was a welcome breath of fresh air during these challenging times. Camden Community Center Receives LEED Certification —On April 24, Camden Community Center will receive its LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Certification from the U.S. Green Building Council. As the City's first LEED certified building, the community center was designed and constructed to conserve natural resources, save tax dollars and create a healthier indoor environment for the community to enjoy. The two-year construction project included the addition of a multi-purpose room, teen room, classroom and administrative offices adding an extra 19,000 square feet of green building to the center. San José Ranked 19th Best Walking City — San Jose is ranked the 19th best walking city in the United States according to a comprehensive ranking of the nation's largest 100 cities. The American Podiatric Medical Association (APMA) joined with Prevention Magazine and Sperling's Best Places to evaluate metro areas based on 19 criteria, including population density, use of mass transit and square miles of local and state parks. San Jose was also recognized for having the most walking and hiking trails of any other city reviewed. Park Volunteers Recognized at Annual Barbeque Event —On April 18, PRNS' Volunteer and Adopt-A-Park/Trail programs held their annual Park Volunteer Recognition Barbeque at Almaden Lake Park. Approximately 50 volunteers and their families attended the event intended to recognize their ongoing support in maintaining quality parks and facilities. PRNS Hosts First Citywide Children's Basketball Tournament —Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services (PRNS) hosted the first "Premiere Citywide Competitive Basketball League" series for 275 children, ages 9-12. Children from across the City took part in a one-day skills clinic and eight weeks of competitive play. Students from Southside, Los Paseos, Alum Rock, Hank Lopez, and Berryessa Community Centers participated in the series. Championship games were held at the Berryessa and Alum Rock Youth centers, leading up to the finals on Saturday, April 18 where the Berryessa Community Center teams played against teams from Alum Rock Youth Center. Both Berryessa teams were victorious this season. With this successful pilot program, PRNS is looking to build on its success, beginning the next league in September 2009. Bamboo Garden Plants Treated for Pest Infestation —On April 18, PRNS staff treated unhealthy giant grey bamboo plants which landscape the outside of City Hall. The plants have recently become infested with a pest called Bamboo Pit Scale, causing the bamboo stalks to dry up and die. Staff addressed the problem by removing dead stalks and applying pesticide to eliminate any remaining scale. San José Downtown Parking Guidance System (PGS) — The Department of Transportation recently completed Phase II of the PGS system, which involved installing 13 street level signs throughout the downtown to provide motorists with information about parking availability. These signs complement the Phase I garage mounted PGS signs installed at seven City facilities. The PGS signs display the "real-time" number of available spaces in City facilities, reducing the amount of time motorists spend searching for parking which helps to reduce traffic congestion downtown and vehicle emissions. The signs can also be used to display custom messages during major events such as showing evening parking rates and directing motorists to alternate parking facilities when parking facilities fill-up. Illegal Creekside Encampment Cleanup Removes Over 14 Tons of Trash —On April 18, removal of trash and debris from five creekside illegal encampments took place along the Coyote Creek and Guadalupe watershed in Council Districts 3, 4, 6 and 7. To date, these expanded encampment clean-ups have removed 48.67 tons of trash and debris from City creeks. These events are a coordinated effort with the Police, Transportation, Environmental Services (ESD), PRNS and the Santa Clara Valley Water District. For each clean-up event, notices are posted prior to the clean-up day, supervised labor is provided by the County Department of Corrections for debris removal, and trash is then hauled to the landfill. 63 Pounds of Unused and Expired Pharmaceuticals Collected for Proper Disposal —On April 17, ESD staffed a pharmaceutical collection booth at the West Valley Senior Walk held at the Westfield Valley Fair Mall. A total of 63 pounds of unused and expired medicines were collected from 30 area residents. Staff enlisted the services of the Santa Clara County Household Hazardous Waste Program for disposal of the collected medicines. COPS Hiring Program Recovery Update —At the April 7 Council Meeting, staff received approval to apply for grant funds from the COPS Hiring Program to hire and fund up to 75 police officer positions. On April 14, staff submitted the City's final grant application requesting funding for 25 police officers. The decision to apply for funding for this number of officers was influenced by the grant guidelines which commit the City to retain grant-funded officer positions for at least 12 months after the 36-month grant cycle. In light of forecasted General Fund shortfalls, it was determined that it was prudent to apply for 25 positions to ensure that the grant's retention obligation could be met at the end of the 36-month cycle. The COPS Hiring Recovery Program is funded through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. For more information, contact Lisa Perez at 277-2450.

Green IT —As part of the City's continuing efforts toward "green" technology, the Information Technology Department has worked with its personal computer (PC) supplier to move toward eco-friendly packaging whenever possible. In doing so, the City's supplier now transports desktop PCs in a bulk packaging model (see picture below) which requires smaller delivery vehicles and translates to 6.67 pounds reduction per PC, in packaging material (or 19% of the total PC weight of a traditional PC shipment).
