Following are the key activities to be highlighted this week:

Alaska Airlines Announces New Flights from San José to Maui and Kona—On November 10, Alaska Airlines announced that it will inaugurate three-times-weekly service between San José and Kahului, Maui, beginning March 11, 2010, and four-times-weekly service between San José and Kona on the Big Island of Hawaii starting March 12, 2010. The Airport's ongoing surveys of travelers in San José and Silicon Valley have found a very strong interest in having direct Maui flights from SJC. Alaska will operate the new flights with Boeing 737-800 aircraft, accommodating 16 passengers in first class and 141 in the main cabin. Alaska is offering introductory one-way fares of \$169 between San José-Maui and San José-Kona for tickets purchased by November 24, 2009. Alaska also restored the SJC-Austin "Nerd Bird" in September, and it already announced a second daily departure to Austin to begin in March. Project Veterans Connect—On November 10, the City's Housing Department, in conjunction with EHC LifeBuilders partnered to honor homeless Veterans by coordinating a Project Veterans Connect event. Fifteen service providers gathered at the One Stop Center (located at the Boccardo Reception Center) to provide 87 homeless Veterans with a variety of services, including medical, dental, haircuts, employment, addiction support, and permanent housing. The next Project Homeless Connect event will take place January 2010 and will coordinate services for the unhoused community in Los Gatos. USO Opens its Permanent Home in Newly-Opened Terminal—On November 10, after 18 years of operating out of temporary quarters in seven different locations at the Airport, the USO at SJC celebrated its final move into a new, comfortable and spacious home in the new Terminal B Concourse. Its new permanent facility includes a lounge, computers, kitchen, secure bag storage, library, and restrooms in 2,060 square feet of space serving approximately 11,000 military personnel and their families traveling through the airport each year. Staffed entirely by volunteers, the USO has operated at SJC since July 1991. The new street-level location in the Terminal B Concourse places the USO conveniently between Terminal A and the new Terminal B, scheduled to open in June 2010. Google to Support Complimentary Wi-Fi for the Holidays at the Airport—Mineta San José International Airport and Google have partnered to make the holiday season easier for travelers with complimentary, terminal-wide Wi-Fi beginning November 10 through January 15, 2010. SJC launched its free full-service wireless Internet service in May 2008. This year Google offered to support the Airport's system during the holidays. This is a natural partnership between Google and the Airport to provide the best customer service for travelers. Google's gift to the nation's travelers during this holiday season includes similar partnerships with more than 45 airports that together handle 500 million passengers each year, or about 35 percent of the total number of annual passengers in the U.S. Google will also run some limited promotions for its products on airport networks' sign-in pages.
