INFORMATION

When the City Council approved the current contract with Fairbanks, Maslin, Maullin & Associates for consultant survey services in 2008, it directed the Administration to provide draft survey questions to the City Council for review prior to initiating the survey field work. Consistent with that direction, draft questions for the 2010 Budget Prioritization Survey are attached.

As has been the case in past years, the survey tests public attitudes about various alternatives that could potentially be used to bring the City's budget back into balance. Potential revenue measures are tested, and respondents will also be asked how they would prioritize certain programs and services. In addition, this year's survey will provide data on how respondents would prioritize spending in five major priority goal areas for the City. This information will be used as part of the Program Prioritization effort that is currently underway.

In order to ensure that the survey results have been publicly distributed prior to the February 16th Budget Study Session, the survey must be finalized and in the field by January 14. As a result, **all comments on the survey must be received by Friday, January 8**, in order to be considered. Please email or route your comments directly to me by that date.
