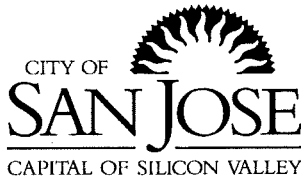

INFORMATION

Following are the key activities to be highlighted for this week:

Police Chief Recruitment Outreach Update—As a follow up to my presentation to Council on Tuesday, staff and/or I have met this week with the members of the Chamber of Commerce, Boards and Commissions, the County Public Defender and the Coalition for Justice and Accountability. In addition, members of my staff held a community input session regarding the Police Chief Recruitment after the conclusion of the Live United Community Breakfast. In addition, CMO staff coordinated with United Way Silicon Valley to distribute the online link to the Police Chief Recruitment Community Survey to 500 attendees of the Community Breakfast.

As an update to the September 3rd Weekly report regarding targeted outreach to 19 Strong Neighborhoods Initiative Neighborhood Action Coalitions (NACs), staff has worked with the NACs to identify nine NAC meetings covering all eight Council Districts in the Strong Neighborhoods Initiative Project Area that will host a 1 hour Community Workshop. These workshops will be mainly focused to inform attendees about the recruitment and to gather input on the ideal qualities sought in a new Police Chief. Many NACs have already begun to reach out to their neighbors to promote attendance. On September 15, staff held the first of nine evening community workshop meetings with the Hoffman/Via Monte NAC, which garnered an audience of 25 attendees. The upcoming NAC meetings are included in the upcoming events section of this report. For Council District neighborhoods that do not have NACs or are not located in a Strong Neighborhoods Initiative area, staff will coordinate with each Council Office to discuss/develop other approaches to receive this level of input.

Next week, my staff and I will be holding the South San Jose Community Outreach meeting on Monday, September 20 at the Oakgrove School District Offices, Board Room from 6:30-8:00pm. On October 4, we will also be holding an additional East San Jose Meeting at the Mexican Heritage Plaza, Pavilion from 7:00-8:30 pm. Flyers in English, Spanish and Vietnamese are attached. In addition, members of my staff will be presenting information about the recruitment at three Alum Rock Unified East Side District (ARUESD) Community Forum Meetings at Sheppard (9/21), Matheson (9/22) and Fisher (9/23) Middle Schools, all from 6:00-8:00 pm in their respective Cafeterias. In addition, staff will also have a resource table at ARUESD Parent Empowerment Conference on Saturday, September 25 starting at 10:30 am.

Airport Passenger Traffic Down 2.7% in August—Airport passenger activity fell 2.7% in August 2010 compared to August 2009, and the number of daily commercial passenger operations was down 14.4%. SJC flights continue to have very high load factors, approaching an average of 80% over the summer compared to 73% last summer, which means that most planes leaving San Jose are nearly full. The Airport is working with the Mayor's Office, Council offices, Office of Economic Development, and other partners to engage active Silicon Valley business and community support for increased air service and restoration of flights lost over the past three years. Housing Department Database—On September 13, the City's Housing Department went live with its new "Housing Loan Management System (HoLMS) – a web-based solution provided by Salesforce.com and configured to meet the City's specific needs by consultant MKPartners. The system contains 158 multi-family project City loans, totaling \$609 million in assets. All affordability restriction information is incorporated for compliance monitoring purposes. The new system will provide the City with tools to improve management of its loan portfolio. Over the course of the next year, the Housing Department will incorporate all of its Housing Rehabilitation and Homeownership loans into HoLMS. Phase 1 of Reuse RFI to Close September 30—Phase 1 of the Community Center Reuse Request for Interest (RFI) process is set to close on Thursday, September 30, 2010. The City's Parks, Recreation & Neighborhood Services (PRNS) Department issued the RFI for the Reuse Program on Wednesday, August 25, to identify potential non-profit organizations to provide services at community center sites formerly operated by City staff. The RFI process is divided into two phases:

- **Phase 1** includes six facilities serving high-need populations/neighborhoods in the City of San José and includes Alma, Alum Rock, Alviso, Gardner, Starbird, and Washington United and closes on September 30.
- **Phase 2** includes solicitation of qualified Service Providers for the remaining 15 sites on the 2010-11 Reuse list. The Phase 2 RFI is anticipated to be released on November 2010.

Organizations interested in providing service at any of the designated community center sites need only to complete a simple one-page application. Alaska Airlines to Start Service Between San Jose and Guadalajara—On September 16, Alaska Airlines announced that it will inaugurate service between Mineta San José International Airport and Guadalajara starting Wednesday, December 15, 2010. Alaska Airlines continues to demonstrate its strong commitment to San Jose and Silicon Valley, and the new flight to Guadalajara builds on Alaska's recent additions of service from San Jose to Maui, Kona, Kauai, Austin, and Cabo San Lucas. The Guadalajara flight will leave San Jose at 10:50 pm on Monday, Wednesday, Friday, and Sunday, and will arrive in San Jose at 8:50 a.m. on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday. City's First Joint-Use Community Center Grand Opening Scheduled for September 25—The Edenvale Community Center, the City's first joint-use community center, will celebrate its grand

opening on Saturday, September 25. The joint-use facility is a collaborative effort between the City, the San Jose Redevelopment Agency and the Oak Grove School District and is designed to create a shared community building and recreational space for public and educational purposes. The project was funded by the Redevelopment Agency and the City of San Jose with Oak Grove Unified School District providing the land for the facility. The Center, located at 330 Branham Lane East in the Edenvale/Great Oaks Strong Neighborhoods Redevelopment Project Area, will enhance the Oak Grove School District's ability to provide sports, physical education and cultural activities during school hours. Edenvale will offer recreational and community space for the Boys & Girls Club and surrounding neighborhood after school. For more information, contact Dan Wax, Division Manager, at 535-3576.

Successful Start-up Period for New Airport Baggage System Completed—The removal of the interim TSA baggage screening systems began this week with the completion of the specified period of continuous error-free operation of the new automated in-line baggage screening systems at Terminal A and Terminal B over the previous 30 days. TSA began removing its older explosive detection equipment from its temporary screening facility adjacent to Terminal A near Gate 12 this week, and demolition of the second screening facility near Gate 6 is already underway. All demolition work is scheduled to be completed by mid-October, and the installation of the Gate 12 passenger boarding bridge is scheduled to begin in early November. Gate 12 is the final one to be replaced as part of the full renovation of Terminal A, and it is expected to be placed in service prior to the Thanksgiving holiday. Public Art Exhibit Featuring Wastewater Photography Now Installed on Fourth Street—Robert Dawson, renowned for his photographic explorations of water infrastructure and issues, completed a six-month residency at the Water Pollution Control Plant (Plant) and is now exhibiting a selection of his photos in the City Hall windows along 4th Street. Entitled *The Conscience of the City: Treating Wastewater in Silicon Valley*, the exhibit features the workers, lands, treatment process, and history of the Plant, and will be in place through January 2011. Dawson produced more than 2,000 photographs, including many extraordinary images that may surprise viewers. A smaller exhibit, entitled *Plant Life*, is also installed at the Martin Luther King, Jr. Library – 4th Floor, now through Oct. 1, 2010. The Environmental Services Building at the Plant site also permanently exhibits Dawson's work, and production of an e-book, to reside on the city's website, is underway. The Cultural Affairs Office and Environmental Services Department (ESD) collaborated on this project; ESD administers capital improvement projects at the Plant and these generate the 1%-for-art funds used for Dawson's and future public art works. San José Receives National Exposure for the Library's Early Care and Education Services—On August 25-27, in Clinton, Tennessee, the Library's Early Care and Education Services Manager, Dawn Perry, and County Office of Education Early Learning Services Director, Lisa Kaufman, having been invited by the Children's Defense Fund (CDF) and the National League of Cities Institute for Youth, Education, and Families, presented on a panel at the CDF Summer Institute entitled *Data Driven Decisions: Separating Fact from Fiction in Building Early Care and Education Systems*. Ms. Perry shared information about data gathered locally on San José's young children and their families and current initiatives that support kindergarten readiness and academic achievement, including SJ2020, the Santa Clara County Early Learning Master Plan,

San José Public Library Celebrated International Literacy Day—On September 1, Councilmember Kansen Chu, The City's Public Library, and San José State University, joined with the participants of the Library's *Partners in Reading* adult literacy program to celebrate International Literacy Day. During the program, participants released the 2010 book of learner writings, titled "Good Food, Good Memories." Several learners bravely read their stories aloud in front of the over 100 member audience. Angel Escamila was honored as Learner of the Year for his accomplishments. This year, Partners in Reading served 335 adult learners with the help of 312 volunteer tutors which represents a 31% increase for both groups over last year. Established in 1989, Partners in Reading has trained over 3,400 volunteer tutors and served over 4,300 adult learners. Tutors customize instruction to address real life goals such as getting a job, understanding a medical diagnosis, developing computer skills and reading a job manual. A Day of Service—On September 11, Housing Department staff participated in "A Day of Service" which was organized by Sacred Heart Community Services. The event was held at the Western Trailer Park on Monterey Road – which houses approximately 90 of the areas lowest income residents – to commemorate the attacks of 9/11. 

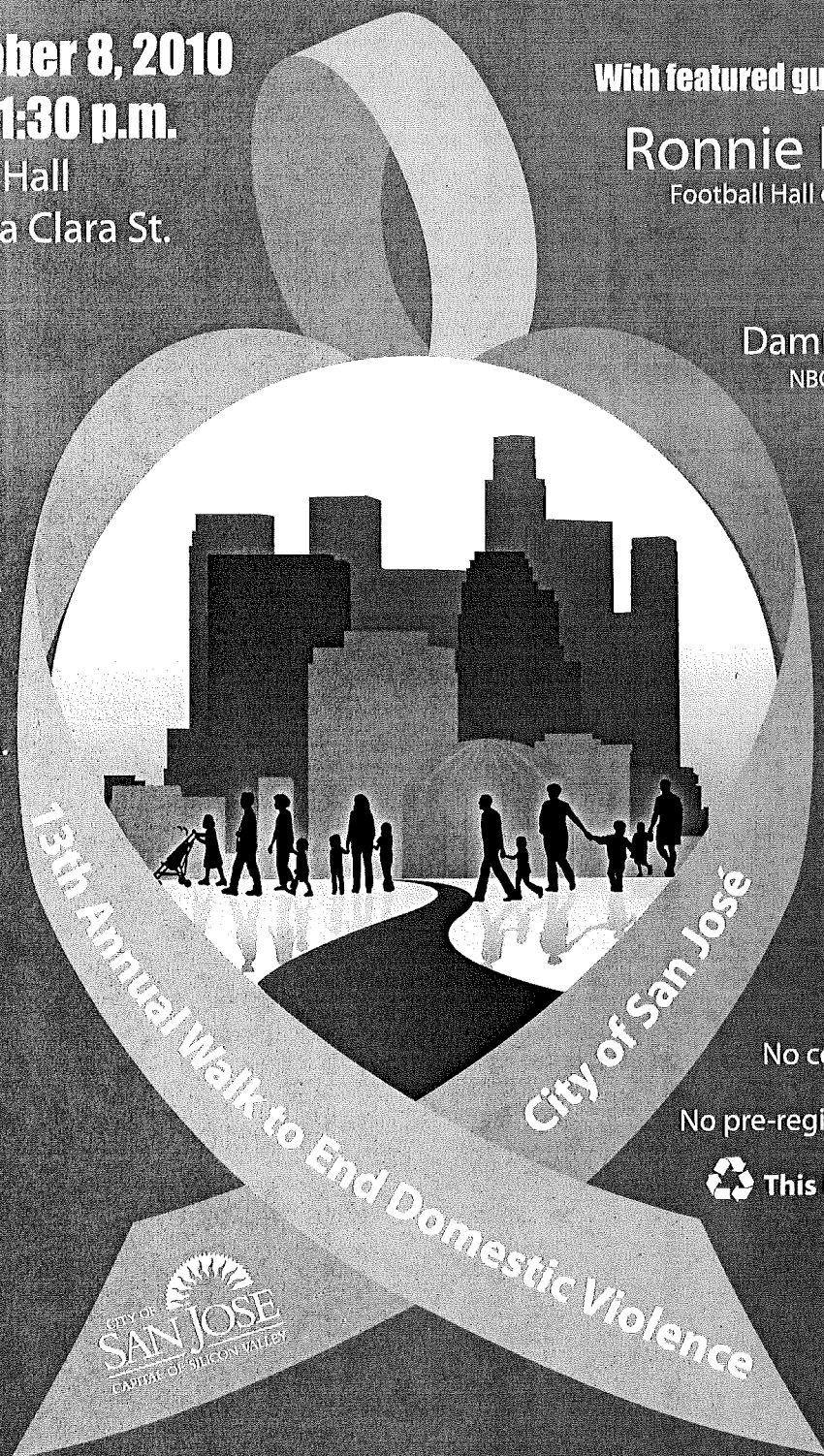
