Due to the upcoming furlough, the final edition of the Manager's Weekly for 2010 will be December 17. The Weekly will resume on January 7, 2011.

City Emergency Shelter Site List Updated—Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services (PRNS) has replaced two locations on the City's Emergency Shelter List with new sites. In Council District 1, Cypress Community Center will replace the West San Jose Center as the emergency shelter site. In Council District 5, the Shirakawa Center has been replaced with the new Seven Trees Community Center. There are ten centers, one in each Council District, designated as emergency shelters in event of an evacuation. Neighborhood Park Restrooms Holiday Closures—Neighborhood park restrooms will be closed for the Holidays from Thursday, December 23 through Saturday, December 25. They will reopen on Sunday, December 26. The restrooms will also be closed Thursday, December 30 through Saturday, January 1 for New Year's. They will reopen on Sunday, January 2. Alaska launches New Air Service from San Jose to Mexico—On December 4, Alaska Airlines launched service from SJC to Cabo San Lucas. The three-times-weekly flight is the first route to Mexico from San Jose by Alaska, but it will be joined by a new daily flight to Guadalajara that is scheduled to start on Wednesday, December 15. In addition, Horizon Air, Alaska's sister carrier, will resume its winter season service from SJC to Mammoth Mountain ski area on December 16. Alviso residents, several Water District Board members, and environmental group representatives. The consultants conducting the feasibility study presented their findings on five concepts: bulk port, ferry terminal, expanded marina, hovercraft, and entertainment waterfront. Of these, two concepts will be further analyzed, the hovercraft operations and the entertainment waterfront, primarily to reduce the need for costly dredging. The feasibility study is funded by a grant from the federal Economic Development Administration (EDA), with matching funds from the Santa Clara Valley Water District, the City of San José, and the County of Santa Clara. The Showcase will give visitors hands-on experience with advanced solar, wind and energy efficient technologies as well as provide information required to make informed decisions about clean energy options. First Month of Fountain Contractual Maintenance Completed—The first month of contractual maintenance of the Municipal Rose Garden fountain was recently completed. With funding support from Council District 6, staff has worked to establish contractual maintenance of the fountain through the end of this fiscal year. Staff is working with the Friends of the San Jose Rose Garden to establish funding to support continuing the contractual service beginning in July of 2011.
