Gang, Crime Prevention Summit, Community Meeting Address Recent Violence—

On January 22, the Mayor's Gang Prevention Task Force (MGPTF) hosted the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Crime and Gang Prevention Summit at the new Seven Trees Community Center. Over 300 residents and officials participated in the workshop with topics including Gangs 101, Faith-Based Partnerships, and Clean, Safe and Connected Communities. The summit continues the City's commitment toward building community awareness, trust and true community engagement. The event ended with a resource fair and luncheon for all attendees.

Three of the seven recent homicides in San Jose were determined to be gang-related. These tragic events have made community events such as the above-mentioned Gang Summit crucial to ensure ongoing communication between the MGPTF and the impacted communities and families. In each of the three incidents, the City's mobilization and execution of safety programs/ protocols minimized continued escalation and retaliation. The responding community crisis protocols and programs are the Community Response Protocol, Safe School Campus Initiative, and City-wide Crisis Intervention Teams. The MGPTF has conducted and scheduled additional community meetings in connection to the recent violence.

San Jose Family Camp to Open for 2011 Season—San Jose Family Camp will offer a Summer Season and Post-Season camping for 2011. Family Camp will have its Early Walk-in Registration for the 2011 Summer Season on Saturday, March 5, with the summer season opening on June 17. Camp extends through October 16 with its Post-Season programming. Campers will see an approximate 18% fee increase to ensure operational expenses as well as the lease payment and capital infrastructure allocations are cost-recovery. The popular Fish Camp and Pre-Season, usually scheduled for April and May, will not be available this year as repairs on the dining hall will be underway. The U.S. Forest Service approved the one-year lease extension for 2011 while the City completes its cost evaluation for operation in 2012 and into the future. ANA is Japan's second largest carrier, and Silicon Valley's airport has been engaged with the airline for the past three years to explore and develop a potential new route between San Jose and Tokyo. The Mayor's delegation will present a comprehensive business case to ANA to assist the airline's future route decisions based on many SJC advantages. 
