Community Workshop Scheduled to Discuss PAL Sports Complex Improvements – On March 2, staff will hold a community workshop to seek community input and to discuss potential improvements to the Police Activities League (PAL) Sport Complex. The workshop will be held at 6:30 p.m. in the Emma Prusch Farms Meeting Hall, located at 647 South King Road. The Complex, located at the end of 34th Street (Council District 5), includes a softball field, a baseball diamond, a football/soccer field, a running track, and a boxing ring. Proposed upgrades involve removing the existing running track and football/soccer field and replacing it with an artificial multi-use athletic turf field and updating the existing field lighting. To date costs for the proposed project have not been finalized. The Sports Complex is located on land owned by the City and is managed by the Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services Department.
