C. Biosolids Public-Private Partnership Facility Status Report

Staff Recommendation:

Accept the status report on the proposed biosolids public-private partnership facility at the San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility.

During discussion on this item, Senior Deputy City Attorney Rosalia Burgueno-Tapia requested confirmation that committee member Rowena Turner's virtual participation in the meeting as an acting voting member was in accordance with AB 2449's Just Cause or Emergency requirements. City Attorney Burgueno-Tapia read portions of AB 2449 aloud and asked committee member Turner if just cause or emergency applied. Committee member Turner's responses confirmed that neither just cause or emergency was shown, pursuant to AB2449, and, therefore, she could not participate virtually as an acting voting member.

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Chair Cohen proceeded to ask for public comment on the item under consideration. Member of the public, James Dunbar, General Manager of Listek International, a vendor involved in the public-private partnership, spoke in support of the goals of the project. ESD Director Kerrie Romanow and Assistant Director Chavez-Vazquez responded to questions from committee members Hardy, Kwok, Montano and Chair Cohen regarding project timelines, Newby Island landfill, initial project capacity goals and future options, vendor compliance, and long term capability and capacity to deliver assurance.

7. STATUS OF ITEMS PREVIOUSLY RECOMMENDED FOR APPROVAL BY TPAC

A. Recommendation to the City Council on Insurance Renewals for San José-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility

Staff Recommendation:

Recommend that the City Council authorize the Director of Finance to:

- (a) Select and purchase City property and liability insurance for the San José Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility for the period October 1, 2023 to October 1, 2024, at a total cost not-to-exceed \$633,887 as well as an 18 percent contingency for additional property or assets scheduled, subject to the appropriation of funds with the following carriers:
- (1) Factory Mutual Insurance Company for Property Insurance, including Boiler & Machinery and Terrorism Risk Insurance Act Coverage;
- (2) Beazley Syndicate 2623/623 at Lloyd's for Terrorism Insurance;
- (3) The Princeton Excess and Surplus Lines Insurance Company and Arch Specialty Insurance Company for \$15 million in Excess Flood Insurance on a 50/50 quota share basis; and
- (4) Gemini Insurance Company for Auto Liability Insurance for the vehicle fleets at the San José Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility.

This item was approved by City Council on September 26, 2023.

There were no comments from the committee or public on this item.

8. <u>REPORTS</u>

A. Open Purchase Orders Greater Than \$100,000 (including Service Orders)

Monthly Procurement and Contract Activity Reports summarizes the purchase and contracting between \$100,000 and \$1.3 Million for Goods and \$100,000 and \$320,000 for Services.

Committee member Kwok stated that the Biosolids project was consistent with Cupertino Sanitary District standards.
