FISCAL YEAR 2009-10 WORK PLAN

#### RECOMMENDATION

The City Auditor's Office recommends that the Rules and Open Government Committee review and approve of the City Auditor's Fiscal Year 2009-10 Work Plan.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The mission of the City Auditor's Office is to independently assess and report on City operations and services. To fulfill this mission, the Auditor's Office conducts performance audits that identify ways to increase the economy, efficiency, effectiveness, and accountability of City government, and provide independent, reliable, accurate, and timely information to the City Council and other stakeholders. The City Auditor submits an annual plan to the Rules and Open Government Committee for review and approval. This report presents the City Auditor's Proposed Work Plan for 2009-10.

As part of our annual review of potential audit subjects, we solicit audit suggestions from City Council members, members of the public, and staff. We also use information from the City's adopted operating and capital budgets and financial statements to prepare a spreadsheet model of potential audit subjects. The purpose of the model is to help prioritize audit work. It compares the following seven factors: proposed 2009-10 expenditures, estimated 2009-10 revenue, fund type, number of staff (budgeted full time equivalents, or FTE), fund balance, requests for an audit, and date of last audit. The results of the model are attached (see Attachment A). We generally try to give attention to the top 10 items on that list.

#### DISCUSSION OF PROPOSED AUDIT ASSIGNMENTS

The list of proposed assignments for fiscal year 2009-10 includes a mix of audits and special projects that address a wide range of concerns consistent with the City Auditor's areas of responsibility. We designed the work plan to address what we consider to be the

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highest priority areas, while trying to limit the scope of work to what we can realistically accomplish.

#### FINANCIAL AUDITS:

- 1. **Annual external financial audit and single audit** (contracted audit service) The City Charter requires an annual audit of the City's financial transactions. The City Auditor's Office works with the independent certified public accounting firm of Macias, Gini and O'Connell LLP and the Finance Department to coordinate this effort. Target date for completion of the 2008-09 financial statement audit: Nov-2009.
- 2. Annual audits of Branch Library Bond Projects Fund, the Parks and Recreation Bond Projects Fund, and the Library Parcel Tax Special Revenue Fund (contracted audit service) Macias, Gini and O'Connell LLP will conduct these audits, satisfying the City's obligation for guaranteed annual audits specified in the voter-approved bond measures. Target date for fiscal year 2008-09 audits: Nov-2009.
  - <NEW> Annual audit of Public Safety Bond Projects Fund Although not required in the voter-approved measure, this audit would be consistent with the other bond projects fund audits.
- 3. **Semi-annual compliance reviews of the City's investment program** (contracted audit service) The City's investment policy requires semi-annual compliances audits to determine whether the investments in the City's pooled portfolio are in compliance with the City's investment policy, internal controls, and department procedures. Macias, Gini and O'Connell LLP will conduct the audits as of June 30<sup>th</sup> and December 31<sup>st</sup>. Target date for the next semi-annual review: Sep-2009.
- 4. **NEW> Request for proposals for external audit services** This is the final year of the Macias agreement. In fall 2009, the Office will prepare a request for proposals for external audit services beginning 2009-10.

#### **ON-GOING PROJECTS:**

- 5. **Semi-annual audit recommendation status reports** (on-going) The City Auditor's Office issues reports on the implementation status of all open audit recommendations as of June 30<sup>th</sup> and December 31<sup>st</sup>. We also meet with department staff as needed to discuss progress towards implementing open audit recommendations. Target date: Oct-2009.
- 6. **Quarterly whistleblower hotline monitoring** (on-going) The Office of Employee Relations administers the hotline and handles all incoming calls. The Office of Employee Relations meets with the City Attorney and City Auditor quarterly to review the status of calls received.

- 7. **Annual review of TEAM San Jose, Inc. performance** Annual review to determine whether TSJ met its performance metrics and all key requirements in the Management Agreement as of June 30, 2009. Target date: Dec-2009.
- 8. **Service Efforts and Accomplishments (SEA) Report** (on-going) Second annual report providing data about the cost, quality, quantity, and timeliness of City services. The purpose of SEA reporting is to strengthen public accountability and help improve government efficiency and effectiveness. It incorporates existing performance measurement data, showing five-year historical trends, a variety of comparisons to other cities, and the results of resident surveys. Target date: Dec-2009.
- 9. Audits of Redevelopment Agency Disposition and Development Agreements (on-going) Per an agreement with the Redevelopment Agency, the Auditor's Office will conduct audits of individual Disposition and Development Agreements upon request. Costs of these reviews are reimbursed by the Redevelopment Agency. Target date: TBD.

#### **ALREADY IN PROCESS:**

- 10. Audit of the City's management of federal Recovery Act funds (phase I report draft in process) The City expects to receive millions of dollars through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. The Office will monitor Federal and State guidelines regarding the significant accountability and transparency provision in the Act and will conduct audits of funds as needed on a real-time basis. Federal funding is targeted in the 2009-10 citywide risk assessment (Attachment A). Target date: TBD.
- 11. **Follow-up to the first annual Service Efforts and Accomplishments Report** (report draft in process) Report on what we learned during the preparation for the 2007-08 SEA report to help streamline and enhance the performance measurement and reporting process and encourage performance management. Target date: TBD.
- 12. **Audit of Park Trust Fund administration** (fieldwork in process) Audit of the fee assessment, collection, and allocation process. Target date: TBD.
- 13. **Analysis of Police Department sworn/non-sworn staffing** (fieldwork in process)

   To assess the efficiency and effectiveness of current deployment of sworn versus non-sworn Police department employees. Target date: TBD.
- 14. **Audit of pensionable time reporting** (fieldwork in process) To assess the accuracy and validity of City employee information provided to the Federated and Police and Fire Retirement Systems. Target date: TBD.
- 15. **Audit of animal care and services** (fieldwork in process) To assess the cost-recovery of General Services' Animal Care and Services Division. Target date: TBD.

16. **Audit of decentralized cash handling** (fieldwork in process) – To assess the adequacy of internal controls over cash handling. Target date: TBD.

#### **CARRY-OVER PROJECTS NOT YET STARTED:**

- 17. **Audits of major contracts** (carryover from 2008-09 workplan) The Auditor's Office will begin a series of audits of large contracts to confirm that the City is getting the service that it is paying for and the revenues to which it is entitled. This could include audits of purchasing agreements (e.g. office supply contracts), operating agreements (e.g. golf courses, parking garages), service agreements (e.g. waste hauling, emergency medical services), consulting agreements, or construction contracts. Target date: TBD.
- 18. **Review of community center staffing** (carryover from 2008-09 workplan) To assess the efficiency and effectiveness of community center staffing. This review would provide baseline information about staffing levels pending implementation of a Recreation and eCommerce system that would track facility usage information. Target date: TBD.
- 19. **Police Department secondary employment program** (carryover from FY 2008-09 work plan) The 2008-09 work plan included an audit of the cost of traffic control at road construction projects. Because major revisions to that program are already being proposed per Manager's Budget Addendum #17, we would focus this review on the overall secondary employment program. Target date: TBD.

#### **NEW PROJECTS:**

- 20. **NEW> Audit of information technology general controls** The City's reliance on computer systems for its key business systems and anticipated reductions in the Information Technology Department require additional audit emphasis in this area (operating budget objective).
- 21. **NEW> Take-home vehicles** To assess the cost and reasonableness of current practices and potential opportunities to reduce the number of take-home vehicles.
- 22. **NEW> Traffic citation revenue** The City receives a portion of the fines collected in connection with violations of the State Vehicle Code on City streets. In FY 2009-10, Vehicle Code Fine revenue is estimated at \$3.1 million.
- 23. **NEW> Audit of pension and retiree medical costs** To assess the long-term sustainability of pension benefits and the potential impact of cost increases on City operations. The retirement funds are targeted in the 2009-10 citywide risk assessment (Attachment A).
- 24. **NEW> Community code enforcement** Anticipated staffing reductions may dramatically impact response times.

- 25. **NEW> Audit of card room oversight** Assess the efficiency and effectiveness of the card room regulatory function.
- 26. <NEW> Verification of performance and costs of the Department of Transportation's sewer line cleaning program The Department of Transportation is proposing a pilot High-performing Team service agreement with its sewer line cleaning unit. The Auditor's Office will provide an independently verified assessment of current performance and costs, and review and validation of year-end reports (proposed in City Manager's Budget Addendum #26). Partly because of this request, this project is targeted in the 2009-10 citywide risk assessment (Attachment A).
- 27. <NEW> Annual financial scan of City-funded community-based organizations

   Review and analysis of the annual financial statements submitted by outside organizations receiving more than \$200,000 in City funding in FY 2008-09 that will summarize key financial ratios, findings of the agencies' external auditors, and percent of funding from the City. This first annual report will satisfy Recommendation #5 from the 2008 Audit of the City's Oversight of Financial Assistance to Community-Based Organizations.
- 28. <NEW> Audits of community-based organizations Based on staff input and the annual financial scan of City-funded community-based organizations (see #27 above), assess the performance and financial condition of one or more City-funded community-based organizations. Specific organizations TBD.
- 29. <NEW> Audit of personnel costs The proposed 2009-10 budget for personal services is \$610 million. This audit would review labor costs including overtime, premium pay, step increases, leave costs, and the employee evaluation process. Personal services costs are targeted in the 2009-10 citywide risk assessment (Attachment A).
- 30. **NEW> Review of contract documentation and insurance** Anticipated staffing reductions may impact the administrative oversight in City departments, requiring additional audit emphasis on testing basic internal controls over document retention and insurance certifications (budget objective).
- 31. **NEW> Audit of procurement card transactions** (periodic audit) To test compliance with the City's Procurement Card Policy given proposed increases in dollar thresholds for procurement card transactions.
- 32. **NEW> Affordable housing fee exemptions** To estimate the fiscal impact of exempting affordable housing projects from various fees and taxes (audit request).
- 33. **NEW> Audit of disability retirements** To assess potential factors leading to a high disability retirement rate in the City of San Jose (follow-up to the 2009 *Audit of the City of San Jose's Workers' Compensation Program*). The retirement funds are targeted in the 2009-10 citywide risk assessment (Attachment A).

#### AUDIT ADMINISTRATION AND OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 34. **Monthly status reports** (on-going) The City Charter requires the City Auditor to submit monthly reports to the City Council outlining activities and findings in the immediately preceding calendar month.
- 35. Provide training to City employees on how to incorporate risk analysis and internal controls into their management strategies (budget objective) A session has been scheduled for Sep-2009. Additional sessions on control self-assessment tools and techniques TBD.
- 36. <NEW> Biennial Quality Control Review of the Office of the City Auditor for the period July 2007 through June 2009 The City Charter requires an audit of the City Auditor's office at least every two years. As in previous years, the Auditor's Office will recommend the City Council contract with the Association of Local Government Auditors (ALGA) for a peer review. In return, two San Jose staff members will each participate for up to one week in the peer reviews of other local jurisdictions to be determined.
- 37. <NEW> Provide on-going assistance to the City Manager's Office in the development of a performance management system The forthcoming SEA follow-up report (see #11 above) will include recommendations to help streamline and enhance performance measurement and to encourage performance management.

### Other projects considered but NOT included on the FY 2009-10 work plan

Our proposed work plan encompasses a broad array of City services and addresses several areas targeted by our citywide risk assessment model. There are a number of audit requests and other items that we are unable to accommodate in our work plan due to limited audit resources. Some of those items include:

- Airport operations, capital projects, and general aviation (citizen request);
- Benefits administration Efficiency, effectiveness, and consistency of administration;
- Bingo revenue Consistency of enforcement of general bingo fees (\$50 plus 1.87% of monthly gross payouts); bingo fees generate about \$1,000 per year (staff suggestion);
- City facility energy consumption Evaluate City facilities for progress towards energy efficiency standards (staff suggestion);
- Community-based organization funding decisions Review ranking and prioritysetting processes for fairness and consistency across departments and funding sources (audit request);

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- Employee promotional testing Assess the cost effectiveness of maintaining testing cycles (anonymous request);
- Overhead rates (Community Budget Working Group suggestion<sup>1</sup>);
- Permitting process for high-rise residential (carryover from 2008-09 workplan) The purpose of this audit was to assess the timeliness and efficiency of the permitting process from planning through construction. This project is targeted in the 2009-10 citywide risk assessment (Attachment A); however, we recommend deferring this audit. It is not expected that additional high-rise residential permitting will occur for several years due to the downturn in the local economy.
- Process review of significant requests for proposals (on-going project originally added to our workplan as part of the 2004 City Manager's reforms) The City's Procurement Manual requires the City Auditor's Office to conduct a process review of all significant requests for proposals. The Auditor's Office has reviewed eight unique RFPs over the last several years, but now believes our time will be better spent auditing the implementation of contracts.

## **Next Steps**

As audit work proceeds, I will forward to the City Council monthly reports describing the status and progress towards completing audit projects. As part of our normal audit process, we will notify you when we start each audit to determine if you have any interest or concerns that we can address during our audit. This is intended to ensure that our audits are responsive to your needs. Any subsequent additions to the Work Plan will be forwarded to the Rules Committee for approval. Generally, audit reports will be heard by the Public Safety, Finance and Strategic Support Committee unless the item is considered to be of interest to the full City Council.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> In May 2009, the Community Budget Working Group recommended that our workplan "emphasize the monitoring of tax collections, such as collection of use taxes, the monitoring of overhead payments from non-General Fund programs to the General Fund, and any other assignments most likely to produce General Fund savings or resources." The Finance Department conducts audits of sales and use taxes on an on-going basis. Our proposed workplan includes audits with General Fund impacts and an audit of traffic citation revenue.
