Multi-Family Dwellings (MFDs)

with 5 or more units are required to participate in their local organics curbside collection program and provide access for employees and tenants. MFD properties already meet SB 1383 requirements because food scraps (organics) and compostable paper are sorted and composted when collected with garbage. Food waste does not belong with yard trimmings or recycling.

The new law doesn't change garbage and recycling collection service for multi-family properties.

**Information can be shared digitally or in print.*

✓ Each year, instruct employees and tenants on correct organic waste sorting.

✓ Give new tenants this information within 14 days of move-in.

Yard Trimming Collection

Yard trimmings are collected and processed separately from other materials. Using GreenWaste for yard trimmings meets the law's organic recycling requirements, as it goes to a compost facility. Call GreenWaste (408) 283-4800 to get started.

If MFDs use personal landscapers for yard waste, the material must be composted at a facility. Property owners and managers should ensure their landscapers comply with this law.
