 - Coda Summit national arts conference held in San José October 3-6 went well, bringing more than 400 people to San Jose from all over the county and as well as some international attendees.

2) Several important artwork dedication eventss took place including the End of Watch Police Memorial on October 4, the opening of the new Heinlenville Park in Japantown and the park's Sheltering Wing sculpture by Roger Stoller on October 10, and dedication of Pellier Park in downtown with artwork treatment by artist Norie Sato on October 18.
