PROPOSED HISTORIC DISTRICT DESIGNATION

Meeting Purpose: To discuss the April 30, 2024 nomination by the San José City Council to designate the Schiele Subdivision and Alameda Park neighborhood as a City Landmark District. The meeting will outline the procedure and timeline for the historic district designation process and will include presentations by San José Planning staff and their historical consultants, who will also receive and respond to questions and comments from the public. Meeting comments will become part of the public record to help inform the Historic Landmarks Commission and Planning Commission, which will provide recommendations on the proposed historic district designation to the San José City Council. Additional public comment opportunities beyond this community meeting will be available throughout the process as illustrated in the “Steps in the Historic District Designation” chart below.

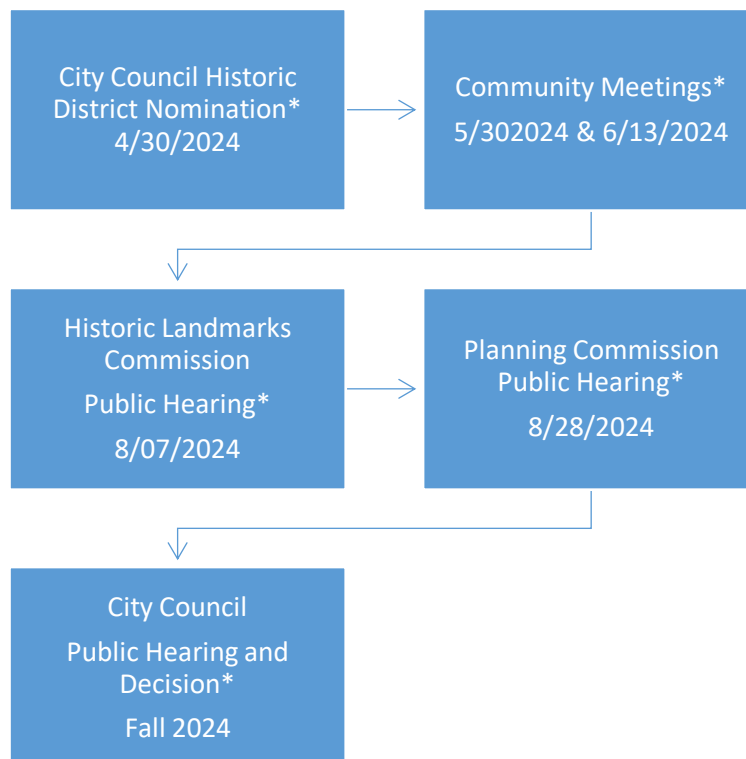

COMMUNITY MEETING CODE OF CONDUCT

The City of San José is committed to providing the information and opportunities to encourage residents to follow development activity in their neighborhoods and to actively participate in the land use development process. The intent of this community meeting today is to inform property owners, residents, and other interested parties about the initiation of the historic district designation process, answer questions, and receive public comments. Staff will take notes on the discussion, respect all input and opinions, and respond to policy and process questions.

If you wish to speak, please refer to the following guidelines:

- Questions and comments will be taken during Open Forum/Questions.
- Depending on the number of speakers, each person may be called upon to speak only once. If time allows a speaker may be called upon more than once. Each speaker will be limited to two minutes of speaking time each time they are called.
- Participants will refrain from behavior which disrupts the community meeting or which may intimidate others who wish to voice their opinions. This will include making loud noises, clapping, shouting, booing, hissing or engaging in any other activity in a manner that disrupts or impedes the orderly conduct of the meeting.
- Harassment of meeting participants including City staff will not be tolerated in any form. If a participant engages in harassing behavior, City Staff will end the meeting or remove the participant from the room.
