Proposal Description, including anticipated outcomes (describe how change would affect services for San José residents, businesses, community groups, etc.):

The segment of Sierra Rd east of Flickinger Rd is notably wide, attracting sideshows, illegal dumping, and oversized vehicle parking. Residents have shared their concerns about this segment for years and have been requesting improvements for these various concerns. The rest of Sierra Road offers a scenic route favored by bicyclists and pedestrians. Enhancing this particular section could deter unwanted activities and ensure uniformity throughout the corridor.

By strategically putting quick build treatments, we will create a safer environment for all members of our community to enjoy and utilize our public spaces without fear or concern for their well-being. By deterring reckless driving behaviors and discouraging the use of public streets for illegal and dangerous activities, we aim to create a greater sense of safety and security among residents.

The proposed quick-build treatment may include curb extension and median island at the intersection of Sierra Rd and Tourney Dr, and median island between Tourney Dr and eastern end of wide section, similar to the ones recently installed at the intersections of Penitencia Rd and White Rd, and Quimby Rd and Murillo Av.

DOT implemented a quick-build sideshow project on Sierra Rd between Lundy Av and Flickinger Av in Spring 2023. Sideshow reoccurrences were still observed at the intersection of Sierra Rd and Flickinger Av. Additional quick-build treatment will be proposed to deter these reoccurrences and include hardened centerline and refuge median island, etc.

BD PROPOSAL: Sideshow Prevention on Sierra Rd

To deter sideshow activities at Sierra Rd between Flickinger Ave and Tourney Dr, DOT is proposing physical deterrents to eliminate or minimize sideshows, illegal racing activities, or "donuts" maneuvering. The scope of work may consist of installation of flexible and rigid traffic control devices, such as paint, raised pavement markers, low profile humps, chatter bars, botts dots, curb systems and delineators, to reduce intersection size and/or narrow roadway space for drifting and donut movements. DOT would need to review the roadway geometry and traffic operations to develop the appropriate treatments. DOT estimates the cost for this segment to be about \$50,000.
