BD PROPOSAL: Crosswalks at Parks

District 2 Council Office received pedestrian safety concerns from residents at the intersection of Snow Drive and Battle Dance Drive and at Lean Drive and Copco Lane:

- 1. Snow Drive and Battle Dance Drive are both 25-mph residential roadways serving a medium to high-density residential neighborhood. Great Oaks Park is located adjacent to the intersection and is frequently used by many residents in this area. There is no marked crosswalk at the intersection. According to residents, pedestrians cross Snow Drive at Battle Dance to access the park. To enhance pedestrian safety, Transportation Department recommends conducting an all-way stop study at this intersection. If the intersection meets the criteria for an all-way stop control, Transportation Department recommends adding crosswalks to all three legs of the intersection. If the intersection does not qualify for an all-way stop, other improvements such as high-visibility crosswalks, curb extensions with plastic bollards, and red curb painting can be considered. Additionally, two pedestrian curb ramps would be needed to provide ADA accessibility. The estimated cost for the study and implementation is \$25,000.
- 2. Lean Drive is a 30-mph neighborhood collector roadway that intersects Copco Lane to form a 4-way intersection. Miner Park is located at the northwest corner of the intersection, and Creekside School is immediately to the north. According to residents, pedestrians cross Lean Drive at Copco Lane to access the park and the school. Currently, there is no marked crosswalk at the intersection. To enhance pedestrian safety, Transportation Department recommends installing an enhanced crosswalk with flashing beacons and concrete curb bulbouts. The estimated cost for the design and construction of this project is \$75,000.
