**Independent Accountant's Report
on Applying Agreed-Upon Procedures**

We have performed the procedures enumerated on pages 3 through 6 which were agreed to by the Department of Retirement Services (Department) of the City of San José (City), California, solely to assist you in determining if the pensionable salaries, contributions and adjustments are being calculated accurately and if the information is being transmitted to and recorded by the Department are in accordance with the City's Municipal Code for the periods specified in the procedures.

The Department and the City's Finance Department are responsible for establishing and maintaining adequate systems and internal controls to comply with the City's Municipal Code. This agreed-upon procedures engagement was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. The sufficiency of these procedures is solely the responsibility of those parties specified in the report. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

Our procedures and findings are presented on pages 3 through 10.

We were not engaged to, and did not, conduct an audit, the objective of which would be the expression of an opinion, on whether pensionable salaries, contributions and adjustments are being calculated accurately and whether the information is being transmitted to and recorded by the Department are in accordance with the City's Municipal Code. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to you.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Boards of Administration of the Federated City Employees' Retirement System and the Police and Fire Department Retirement Plan, Department management, and others within the entity, and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

OBJECTIVES

The Department requested Macias Gini & O'Connell LLP's (MGO) assistance in determining if pensionable salaries, contributions, and adjustments are being calculated accurately and if information is being transmitted to and recorded by the Department of Retirement Services (Department) in accordance with the City's Municipal Code for the periods specified in the procedures.

SCOPE

MGO met with personnel from the Department of Retirement Services, the Human Resources Department, and the Finance Department to discuss the following processes:

- Determining eligibility of active employees to participate in the pension plans, including changes in status during employment.
- Methodology used to calculate pensionable amounts.
- Methodology used to capture military pay.
- Methodology used to capture retroactive pay.
- General and application controls over making changes to applications affecting pensionable amounts and pension contribution percentage.

The scope of our procedures included:

- 1,040 records of new employees hired or rehired, or had a change in employment status during the period of 6/29/2008 through 1/10/2009;
- 6,261 active eligible employees as of 1/10/2009;
- 91 employees who had military pay during the period 1/1/2001 through 6/30/2008; and
- 3,465 records of retroactive pay transactions posted during the period 10/21/2007 through 12/1/2007 (representing pay periods ended 11/3/2007, 11/17/2007, and 12/1/2007).

PROCEDURES

To determine if pension-related calculations were performed accurately and appropriately, MGO performed the following:

1. Obtained a listing of earning codes from the City's Finance Department, and met with the Office of the City Auditor to obtain an understanding of its procedures performed related to the City's time reporting and earning codes in PeopleSoft. (Attachment II)
2. Obtained a listing of all new employees and a listing of employees with a change in status during the period of 6/29/2008 through 1/10/2009 from the City's Human Resources Department. We used the employees' social security numbers to compare these two listings to the listing of active members in the Pension Gold records as of 1/10/2009, and to match the employees' hire dates and plan entry dates.
3. Using the listing of matched employees from procedure 2, we randomly selected 25 PTC members, 25 Police and Fire Plan members, and 50 Federated Plan members who were hired or had a change of status during the period of 6/29/2008 through 1/10/2009, to review supporting documents to determine if information was communicated to the Department to establish a pension account for the selected employees. The supporting documents we reviewed were the Personal Action Notice (PAN) and/or Trans Memo to vouch the employees' retirement plan, hire date, and retirement plan entry date to the City's Human Resources and Pension Gold records.

4. Obtained and compared by social security numbers listings of all covered active employees as of 1/10/2009 from the City's Human Resources records and from Pension Gold. Human Resources records include 6,261 active eligible employees and Pension Gold records included 6,250 active members.
5. Using the listing of matched active employees from procedure 4, which included 2,115 Police and Fire Plan members and 4,115 Federated Plan members, we randomly selected one sample of 45 Police and Fire Plan members within 5 different pay periods and another sample of 45 Federated Plan members within 5 different pay periods, and performed the following:

Hours

- Obtained and agreed reported hours from PeopleSoft payroll records to hours reported on timecards.
- Recalculated retirement base hours ("RTE" hours) using the listing of earnings codes from procedure 1.

Earnings

- Recalculated gross pay per payroll records.
- Agreed retirement base earnings ("RTE" earnings) per payroll records to Pension Gold.

Pension Contributions

- Obtained employee and employer contribution rates for the selected pay periods.
- Recalculated employee and employer contributions per payroll records.
- Agreed employee and employer contributions per payroll records to Pension Gold records.

6. Reviewed the interface between PeopleSoft and Pension Gold systems, which was last modified on 12/22/2006.
 - a) Obtained and reviewed interface account and information mapping between PeopleSoft and Pension Gold.
 - b) Met with the Department and identify reconciliation issues after contribution transfer.
 - c) Identified recommendations to update interface mapping.
7. Determined completeness and accuracy of military pay calculations.
 - a) Obtained listings of all active employees who are military reservists from the Human Resources Department and the Department of Retirement Services.
 - b) Attempted to match the two listings for sample selection to review personnel files to determine the period of active duty service.
 - c) Attempted to recalculate pensionable and contribution amounts and compare results to Pension Gold records, but there was not sufficient information to perform this task.
8. Identified earning codes for retroactive pay.
9. Obtained from the Finance Department a list of active, covered employees by bargaining unit having a retroactive pay code posted during the period 10/21/2007 through 12/1/2007 (representing pay periods ended 11/3/2007, 11/17/2007, and 12/1/2007). The listing included transactions that pertain only to Police and Fire Plan members. We randomly selected a sample of 45 transactions for Police and Fire Plan members to perform the following:

- a) Requested the PeopleSoft payroll calculation supporting the selected retroactive adjustments from the Finance Department.
 - b) Agreed the retroactive rate used for the calculation to the authorized rate in the arbitration memorandum.
 - c) Recalculated and agreed the retroactive pay adjustment bases to the PeopleSoft records.
 - d) Recalculated and agreed the contribution adjustments resulting from the retroactive pay adjustment to Pension Gold records.
10. Verified Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) adjustments through the following procedures.
- a) We obtained a master listing of all individuals subject to FLSA corrections during the FLSA cycles¹ from January 1998 to January 2009 ("FLSA Correction Master Listing"), as prepared by the Finance Department. From the FLSA Correction Master Listing, we used the following criteria to select a sample of 10 individuals:
 - 2 active members with the highest adjusted non-pensionable FLSA amount;
 - 2 retirees with the highest adjusted non-pensionable FLSA amount;
 - 4 random selections from the FLSA Correction Master Listing; and
 - 2 random selections from the 8 individuals reviewed by the Office of the City Auditor in its *Audit of Pensionable Earnings and Time Reporting* dated December 2009 (Report No. 09-10).

The table below shows the statistics of the 10 selected samples.

- b) For the sample of 10 individuals selected, we performed the following for each pay period affected by the individual's FLSA correction:
 - Traced the work hours reported in PeopleSoft to hours reported in timesheet queries and microfiche timesheets.

- Recalculated the individual's gross pay for the affected pay periods.
 - Recalculated the pensionable earnings based on pensionable earning codes from paycheck data and compared to PeopleSoft database.
 - Recalculated pre-correction employee and employer contributions using the recalculated pensionable earnings from step c and applicable contribution percentages.
 - Agreed actual pensionable earnings per PeopleSoft to pre-correction pensionable salary (i.e. contributions with "canceled adjusted" or "posted" status) in Pension Gold.
 - Agreed actual employee and employer contributions per PeopleSoft to actual contributions in Pension Gold.
- c) Using the information from above, we then performed the following procedures:
- Recalculated the individual's pensionable and non-pensionable FLSA earnings for the affected pay periods.
 - Agreed the recalculated pensionable and non-pensionable FLSA earnings to amounts included in the master listing provided by the Finance Department.
 - Determined the applicable employer and employee pension contribution percentages for the affected pay periods.
 - Recalculated employer and employee pension contributions for pensionable FLSA earnings by applying the applicable contribution percentages to the recalculated pensionable and non-pensionable FLSA earnings.
 - Agreed the recalculated employer and employee pension contributions to amounts included in the master listing provided by the Finance Department.

PRINCIPAL RESULTS

The results of the procedures listed on pages 3 through 6 are as follows:

Pensionable Salary and Other Retirement Data

Our reconciliation of 7,486 employee and retiree transactions contained in City's Human Resources (HR) and Pension Gold system identified 1,602 exceptions. As shown in Table 1.0, the types of exceptions include:

- Errors in pension pay calculations;
- Unable to match record with Pension Gold records by social security numbers;
- Incorrect dates for hire and retirement entry dates in PeopleSoft; and
- Insufficient support documentation for retroactive adjustments and calculations.

City staff reported some potential circumstances for the discrepancies as follows:

- Immediate termination of City employment upon hiring;
- Activating retirees as rehires to pay out outstanding leave; and
- Untimely updating of records.

Details of each exception can be found in Exhibits A through D and G through I.

¹ The majority of the discrepancies in hire and plan entry dates can be explained by inconsistent use of these dates between PeopleSoft and Pension Gold. Common observations include:

- Hire date in PeopleSoft represent the PTC members' entry dates into the Police Academy, whereas the hire dates in Pension Gold represent the retirement plan entry dates;
- The plan entry dates in PeopleSoft are recorded as of the Sunday (start of the pay period) or the Monday of the pay period in which the actual plan entry dates belong.

² These records had retirement plan entry dates in Pension Gold that preceded the dates in PeopleSoft by 153 to 8,638 days.

³ HR staff explained these employees may have left City employment shortly after hire, which may have caused them to be excluded from the active member listing extracted from Pension Gold. The HR Department also asserts the rehired employees may be "activated" as rehires in PeopleSoft in order to pay out their sick leave balances, but were not actually rehired for employment. As such, they would be deferred vested members in Pension Gold.

⁴ HR staff explained that these records may represent employees on leave of absences who are considered "active employees" in PeopleSoft, but are considered "inactive" in Pension Gold.

Interface between PeopleSoft and Pension Gold

We unsuccessfully tested the interface between PeopleSoft and Pension Gold. We obtained a sample transmittal file and the Pension Gold transmittal layout from the Department of Retirement Service, and requested assistance from the City Department of Information Technology to map selected data fields to PeopleSoft (Exhibit J). We attempted to print screenshots of the corresponding data fields in PeopleSoft, but were unable to do so due to limitations over system access rights and because certain data were calculated by the system and not viewable through PeopleSoft.

Military Pay Calculations

For the period of 1/1/01 through 6/30/08, the City's Human Resources records included 91 military reservists and Pension Gold records included 57 military reservists. We attempted to match the military reservists by name and pay period in which they received military pay, but found no matching records.

Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) Adjustment

Our testing of FLSA adjustments for a sample of 10 individuals comprising 841 pay periods identified 692 exceptions. The types of exceptions include:

- Payroll calculations did not agree with reported hours;
- Recalculated gross pay did not agree with gross pay captured in the payroll system;
- Recalculated employee pensionable (RTE) earnings did not agree with amounts recorded in the payroll system;
- Deviation from holiday-in-lieu pay requirements;

- Recalculated employee and employer contributions using the recalculated pensionable earnings did not agree to PeopleSoft records;
- Recalculated pensionable and non-pensionable FLSA earnings did not agree to the FLSA Correction Master Listing;
- Recalculated employee and employer retirement deductions did not agree to FLSA Correction Master Listing;
- Pensionable pay did not agree between PeopleSoft and Pension Gold; and
- Actual employee and employer contributions differ between PeopleSoft and Pension Gold records.

Key reasons that we identified for the exceptions are:

- Adjustments made to reported hours by timekeepers during payroll process are not reflected in timesheets;
- The City did not capture the FFL amounts in the employee pensionable amounts for the three months after the implementation of the PeopleSoft system in FY2000; and
- Variances in the recalculated non-pensionable FLSA earnings.

Details of each exception can be found in Exhibit M.

- FLSA premium pay which is earned and payable on or after December 28, 1997;
- Incentive pay for successful completion, on an annual basis, of training in Police Anti-Terrorist Tactics as certified by the police department to the Finance Department;
- Incentive pay for completing and maintaining an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) certificate, which is earned and payable on or after July 7, 1991;

- Anti-terrorism training pay received for Fire Department members, which is earned and payable on or after July 1, 2006; and
- Holiday pay or any compensation paid to a member in lieu of holiday pay in the case of any member who retires on or after July 5, 1992. However, we noted a different treatment of holiday-in-lieu pay in the original calculation in the FLSA Correction Master Listing, which includes holiday-in-lieu pay starting with the pay period ended 6/29/2008. In our recalculation, we followed this treatment of holiday-in-lieu pay to show variances that may be caused by other factors. Furthermore, one of the data fields (“RTE Earning”) obtained from PeopleSoft to recalculate pensionable earnings was not available in the microfiche records for pay periods on or before 6/12/1999. We attempted to recalculate this amount using available information to complete the recalculation of pensionable earnings.

Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) Adjustments Prior to PeopleSoft Conversion

Due to the limited availability of payroll data for pay periods ending on or before 7/10/1999 before the implementation of PeopleSoft, the exact amounts of pensionable and non-pensionable salary could not be readily recalculated. The Finance Department alternatively determined pensionable and non-pensionable amounts using available information, and used the resulting their proportionate percentages to total salary to allocate actual salary amounts per payroll records.

For example, an employee’s actual salary for the pay period was \$3,000. Using available information such as worked hours and premium pay, the recalculated pensionable and non-pensionable salaries were \$2,200 and \$800, respectively, which represented 73.3% and 26.7% of total salaries. These percentages were then used to allocate the actual salary of \$3,000. The allocated amount of non-pensionable salary was used to determine the adjustments to employee and employer deductions using the applicable contribution rates for the pay period.

We recalculated the allocations using the methodology as described above. Variances of \$0.01 or below are assumed to be rounding differences and are not counted as an exception. Variances noted as a result of our procedures are included in the items below, as shown in Table 3.0.

Of the 81 exceptions, 68 (84.0%) related to pay periods ended on or before 7/10/1999 prior to the conversion to the PeopleSoft system.

Attachment I – Glossary of Terms

- FLSA cycle Special provisions under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) allow employers of law enforcement and fire protection personnel to calculate overtime based on a 28-day cycle, rather than a 7-day workweek. The FLSA defines overtime on a 28-day cycle as more than 171 hours for law enforcement personnel and more than 212 hours for fire protection personnel.

The City's municipal code section 3.36.020.3 indicates compensation should include "premium pay paid pursuant to the FLSA for regularly scheduled hours for employees who are assigned to a work week averaging 56 hours per week over a twelve-month period."

For City firefighters, an FLSA cycle represents a 212-hour cycle (or 2 pay periods).
- Pension Gold Pension Gold Retirement Solutions is a pension administration software application maintained by Levi, Ray & Shoup, Inc. This software application is used by the Department of Retirement Services to maintain information relevant in determining members' pension benefits.
- PeopleSoft The PeopleSoft application is used by the Human Resources Department starting in fiscal year 1999-2000 to maintain personnel data for all City of San José employees and by the Finance Department's payroll division to process payroll.

The application calculates payroll earnings, taxes, and deductions; maintains balances; and reports payroll data.
- PTC plan - Police Academy Police recruits who have not completed a P.O.S.T. (Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training) approved academy or who otherwise must complete the academy may participate in the PTC plan.

Upon successful completion of the academy program, police recruits who are appointed to the sworn classification of Police Officer will participate in the Police and Fire Department Retirement Plan.
