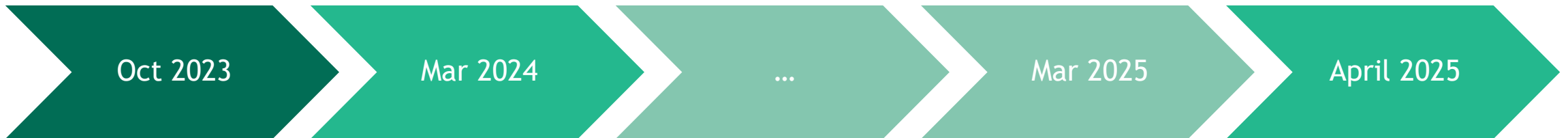

Upcoming engagement with the US Department of Health and Human Services

- ▶ Administration for Children and Families (ACF) in the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) is seeking perspectives from local governments on:
 - ▶ 1) The use of AI in public benefits and service delivery; and
 - ▶ 2) What kinds of guidance and other support local governments would like from ACF/HHS.

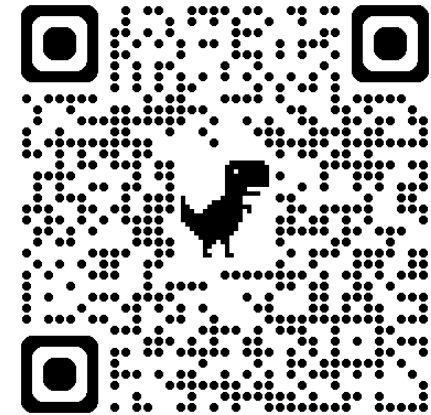

AI Policy

Purpose

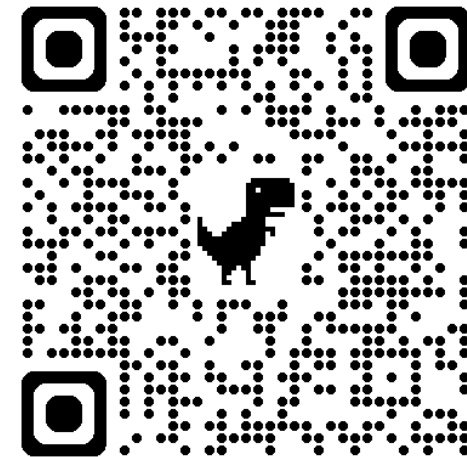
The AI Policy is the agency's broad institutional policy that governs the use of AI systems. The AI Policy applies to all AI systems deployed by the agency and all staff who may be operating or otherwise handling AI systems on behalf of the agency. The AI Policy defines:

- Guiding Principles for responsible AI
- Roles and responsibilities related to the agency's use of AI systems
- AI Review process for AI procurements
- Requirement for vendors to complete the AI FactSheet and comply with Vendor Agreement template
- AI Incident Response Plan
- Prohibited uses of AI systems
- Sunset procedures for AI systems

How to use it

Agency staff participating in the GovAI Coalition present the AI Policy template to their highest governing body (e.g. City Council, Board of Supervisors) for approval. The governing body approves the adoption of the AI Policy. Agency staff across the organization use the AI Policy Manual to implement the AI Policy.

Subject Discussing AI uses in your department

Hi,

Hope you're doing well. We are crafting the [Agency]'s Artificial Intelligence (AI) policy, and want to make sure it aligns with your department's needs. Could you help me understand if we are doing any of the following in your department? Happy to discuss in-person as well, and please feel free to connect me with someone else in your department.

1. Covertly identifying people automatically in real-time. This means:
 - a. We are using technology to identify someone, like facial recognition,
 - b. Identifying in real-time, rather than retroactively as part of an investigation, and
 - c. Identifying them without their knowledge, rather than a fingerprint or Face ID scan that someone knows is happening
2. Using cameras and other sensors to predict someone's emotions, like using a camera to see if someone is angry or happy
3. Automating major decisions like determining someone's bail, likelihood to re-offend, or eligibility for medical care. If we do automate these decisions, is there any human review that happens before or after the decision is made?
4. Automatically "scoring" people for things like credit decisions or access to loans
5. Manipulating vulnerable groups – I assume the answer is no, but hoping to confirm

Our AI Policy needs to enable our departments can provide the best possible services while ensuring our customers that we are using AI responsibly and purposefully. Please let me know if you would like to discuss. We intend to prohibit these applications of AI unless a department has an active use and a compelling case.

INTRODUCTION

The GovAI Coalition is composed of over 300 public servants representing over 150 local, county, and state governments across the nation united in our mission to promote responsible AI in the public sector.

In November 2023, the GovAI Coalition was established to give local government a voice in shaping the future of AI and ensure that AI development is geared toward the benefit of society. Since November, the Coalition has grown to include public agencies that represent XXX million Americans.

As a majority of government agencies are looking towards AI to improve services, our Coalition strives towards a more just and beneficial technological future for all. From generating real-time translations of public meetings to predicting traffic patterns for improved bus routes, AI tools have the potential to make government services more responsive, efficient, and accessible to all.

AI also poses serious risks. Racial discrimination, violations of privacy, and threats to safety are well-documented harms of AI systems used without guardrails.

To improve the lives of all residents while protecting our communities against AI risks, it is vital that public agencies establish safeguards for the responsible use of AI.

OUR DELIVERABLES

AI FactSheet

Purpose

The AI FactSheet is a template that captures the "nutrition facts", or essential technical details, of an AI system. Vendors are expected to complete the AI FactSheet during the procurement process. The AI FactSheet is a critical document that provides agencies the technical information they need to adequately understand, evaluate, and use third-party AI systems.

How to use it

Procurement officers require the **vendor** to complete the AI FactSheet during the procurement process. The **Chief AI Officer**, or the equivalent staff responsible for reviewing AI systems, reviews the AI FactSheet to determine if the technical capabilities of the AI system meet the agency's needs.

Vendors may signal their commitment to responsible AI practices by proactively completing and submitting the AI FactSheet to the Vendor Registry through the Vendor Registry Intake Form. **Staff involved in the use of AI systems by the agency** may view the submitted AI FactSheet in the Vendor Registry to compare vendors or determine if the vendor is a good fit for the agency.

I. PURPOSE

This policy establishes a framework to guide the governance structure that oversees the use of AI systems for the benefit of the community while reducing the associated risks and ensuring the highest quality and security of services.

The key objectives of this AI Policy are:

- Provide guidance that is clear, concise, and supports the accountability for the use of AI systems, ensuring transparency, oversight, and responsible use.
- Establish a framework for the use of AI systems that aligns with the agency's mission and values, and ensures the highest quality and security of services.
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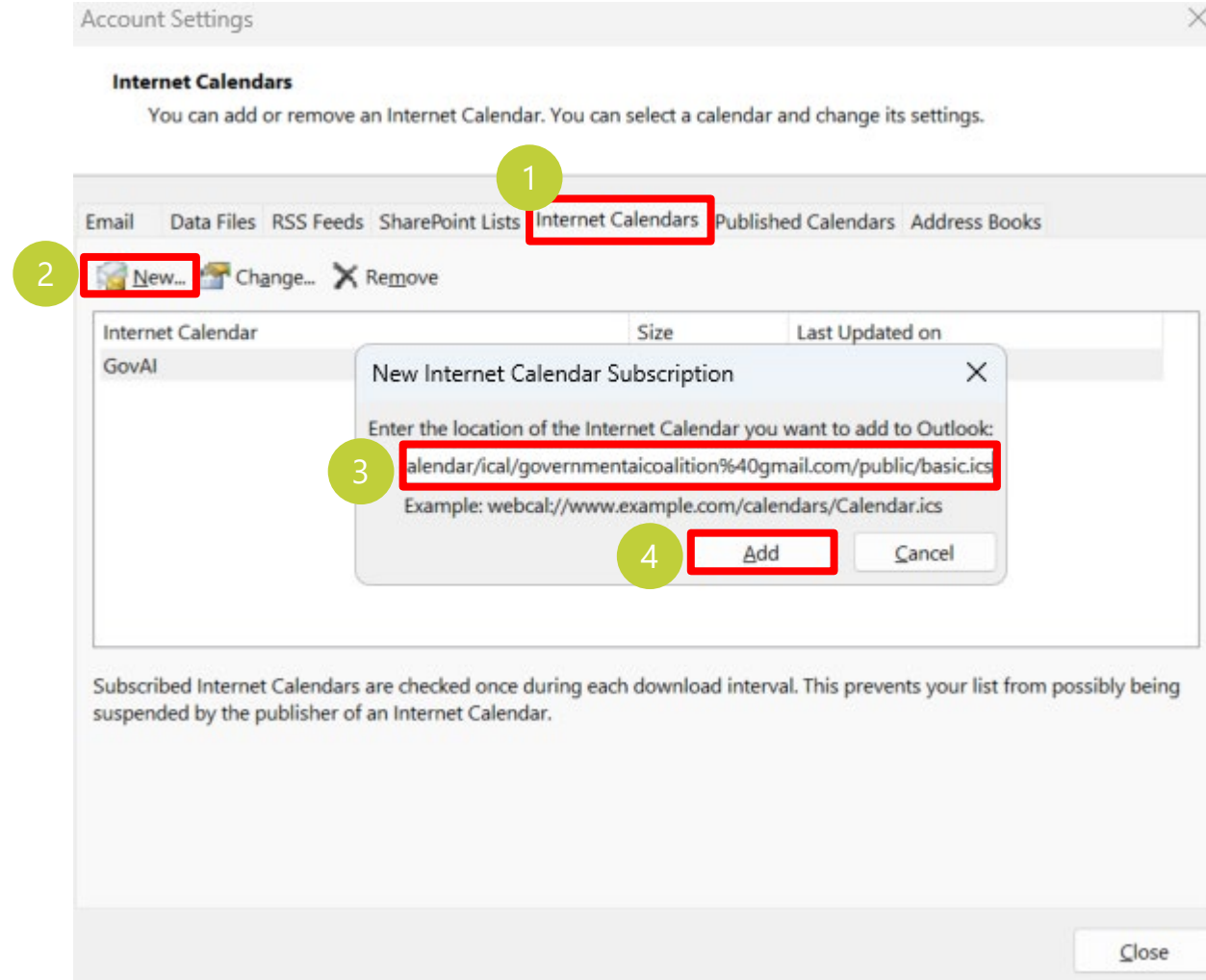
The Department defines "Artificial Intelligence" or "AI" as any machine-based system that can, for a given set of human-defined objectives, make predictions, recommendations, or decisions affecting real or virtual environments. AI systems are machine- and human-based agents that perceive real and virtual environments, discover and generate new knowledge through
