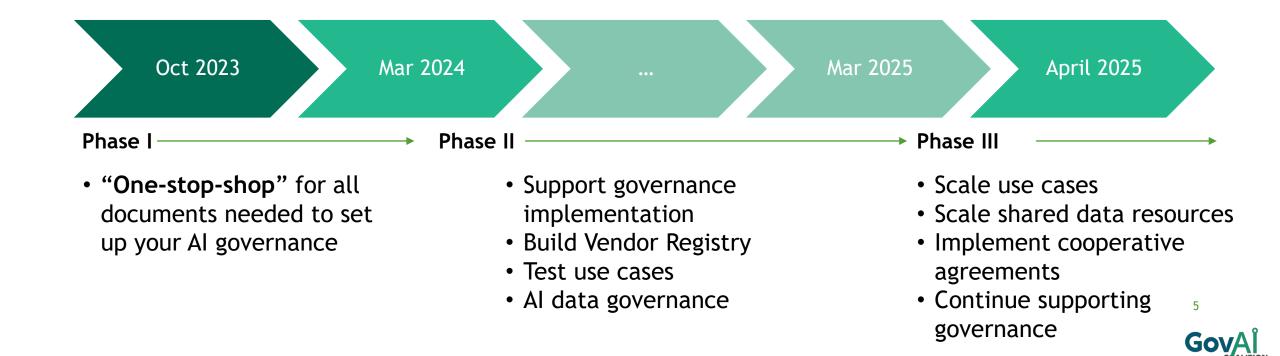
Upcoming engagement with the US Department of Health and Human Services

- ► Administration for Children and Families (ACF) in the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) is seeking perspectives from local governments on:
 - ▶ 1) The use of AI in public benefits and service delivery; and
 - ▶ 2) What kinds of guidance and other support local governments would like from ACF/HHS.
- ► These perspectives will directly inform ACF's AI strategy and the HHS AI strategic plan, including how guidance areas and other supports are prioritized.
- Survey and invitation to a focus group will be shared in late July/early August

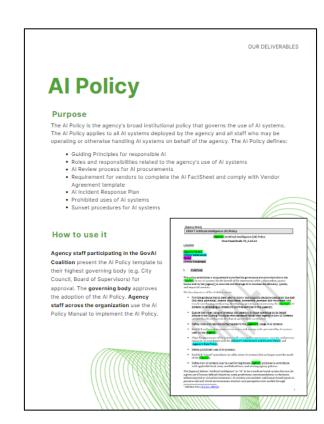

Ηi,

Hope you're doing well. We are crafting the [Agency]'s Artificial Intelligence (AI) policy, and want to make sure it aligns with your department's needs. Could you help me understand if we are doing any of the following in your department? Happy to discuss in-person as well, and please feel free to connect me with someone else in your department.

- 1. Covertly identifying people automatically in real-time. This means:
 - a. We are using technology to identify someone, like facial recognition,
 - b. Identifying in real-time, rather than retroactively as part of an investigation, and
 - c. Identifying them without their knowledge, rather than a fingerprint or Face ID scan that someone knows is happening
- 2. Using cameras and other sensors to predict someone's emotions, like using a camera to see if someone is angry or happy
- 3. Automating major decisions like determining someone's bail, likelihood to re-offend, or eligibility for medical care. If we do automate these decisions, is there any human review that happens before or after the decision is made?
- 4. Automatically "scoring" people for things like credit decisions or access to loans
- 5. Manipulating vulnerable groups I assume the answer is no, but hoping to confirm

Our Al Policy needs to enable our departments can provide the best possible services while ensuring our customers that we are using Al responsibly and purposefully. Please let me know if you would like to discuss. We intend to prohibit these applications of Al unless a department has an active use and a compelling case.

AI Governance

Governance Structure

The governance of AI systems in the [Agency] involves several actors, policies, and practices that work in coordination to ensure that the [Agency] uses AI tools in a responsible manner. The diagram below explains the roles and responsibilities of actors in the [Agency] who frequently participate in AI governance activities.

Al Policy Roles & Responsibilities

Members of the public that your agency serves

The [Agency] is ultimately accountable to the members of the public that it serves.
 For AI uses cases that present a high potential risk, the [Agency] aims to involve the public in the process of reviewing and deploying the AI system. In general, the [Agency] aims to be transparent about how it uses AI with the broader public.

Final Authorit

 [Greatest authority of agency that may need to be involved in certain high-risk applications of AI (e.g., City Council, Board of Supervisors, etc.)]

Escalated Authorit

- The [Chief Information Officer (CIO), or equivalent] approves AI-related policies set forth by the [Thief AI Officer (CAIO), or equivalent] and, if applicable, sends them to [Final agency authority] for final approval.
- The [Attorney Office, or equivalent] reviews Al-related policies from a lega perspective.
- The [Purchasing & Risk Management Office, or equivalent] reviews procurement requests. They may refer procurement requests to the [CAIO, or equivalent] if the procurement seems to involve some technology or AI system.
- Reviewing Authori
- The [CAIO, or equivalent] is the main actor in Al governance activities and responsible for creating Al-related policies and guidance for the [Agency]. The [CAIO, or equivalent] is responsible for ensuring all procurement requests that involve an Al system are given an Al review.
- The [Chief Information Security Officer (CISO], or equivalent] is responsible for ensuring technology procurement requests are reviewed from a cybersecurity perspective.

Department Stakeholde

- Any [Agency] department may submit a procurement request for an AI system.
- · Departments can propose pilots, ideas, or potential use cases of Al.
- Departments have a designated AI lead, responsible for interfacing with the [CAIO, or equivalent] to ensure department is following [Agency] practices. The AI lead also raises concerns from the department around AI to the [CAIO, or equivalent].
- [Pending capacity of organization, if departments have their own CAIOs or equivalents] Department's [CAIO, or equivalent] serves as a first line for reviewing

INTRODUCTION

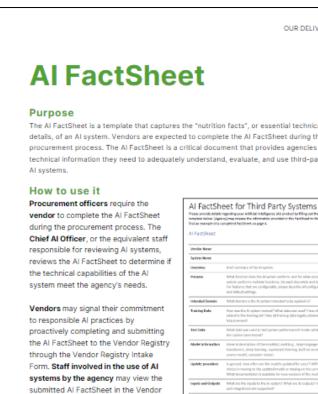
The GovAl Coalition is composed of over 300 public servants representing over 150 local, county, and state governments across the nation united in our mission to promote responsible AI in the public sector.

In November 2023, the GovAl Coalition was established to give local government a voice in shaping the future of AI and ensure that AI development is geared toward the benefit of society. Since November, the Coalition has grown to include public agencies that represent XXX million Americans.

As a majority of government agencies are looking towards AI to improve services, our Coalition strives towards a more just and beneficial technological future for all. From generating real-time translations of public meetings to predicting traffic patterns for improved bus routes, Al tools have the potential to make government services more responsive, efficient, and accessible to all.

Al also poses serious risks. Racial discrimination, violations of privacy, and threats to safety are well-documented harms of Al systems used without

To improve the lives of all residents while protecting our communities against Al risks, it is vital that public agencies establish safeguards for the responsible



OUR DELIVERABLES

The Al FactSheet is a template that captures the "nutrition facts", or essential technical details, of an Al system. Vendors are expected to complete the Al FactSheet during the procurement process. The Al FactSheet is a critical document that provides agencies the technical information they need to adequately understand, evaluate, and use third-party

Registry to compare vendors or determine if the vendor is a good fit for the agency.



OUR DELIVERABLES.

Al Policy

Purpose

The Al Policy is the agency's broad institutional policy that governs the use of Al systems. The Al Policy applies to all Al systems deployed by the agency and all staff who may be operating or otherwise handling AI systems on behalf of the agency. The AI Policy defines:

- . Guiding Principles for responsible Al
- . Roles and responsibilities related to the agency's use of AI systems
- · Al Review process for Al procurements
- · Requirement for vendors to complete the Al FactSheet and comply with Vendor Agreement template
- · Al Incident Response Plan
- · Prohibited uses of Al systems
- · Sunset procedures for Al systems

How to use it

Agency staff participating in the GovAl

Coalition present the Al Policy template to their highest governing body (e.g. City Council, Board of Supervisors) for approval. The governing body approves the adoption of the Al Policy. Agency staff across the organization use the Al Policy Manual to implement the Al Policy.

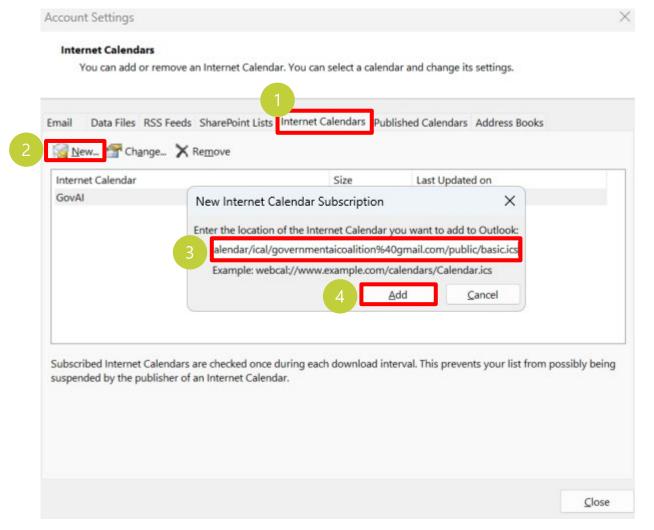

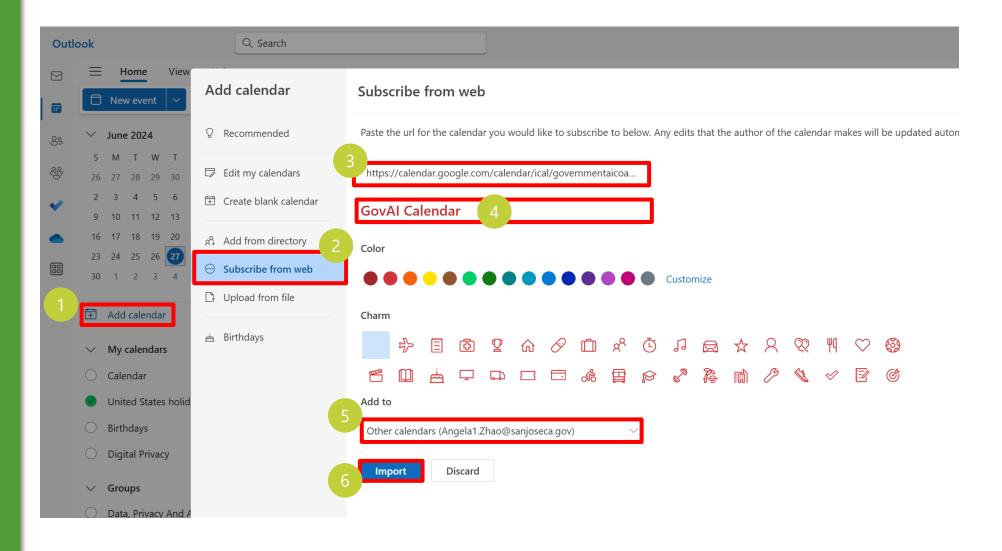


Success on Old Outlook
