DATE: August 7, 2024

RECOMMENDATION

The City Auditor's Office recommends that the Rules and Open Government Committee review and approve the City Auditor's Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-25 Work Plan.

BACKGROUND

The mission of the City Auditor's Office is to independently assess and report on City operations and services. To fulfill this mission, the Auditor's Office conducts performance audits that identify ways to increase the economy, efficiency, effectiveness, equity, and accountability of City government, and provide independent, reliable, accurate, and timely information to the City Council, City Administration, and the public. The City Auditor submits an annual plan to the Rules and Open Government Committee for review and approval. This report presents the City Auditor's proposed work plan for FY 2024-25.

As part of our annual review of potential audit subjects, we solicit audit suggestions from City Council members, members of the public, and City staff. We also use information from the City's adopted operating and capital budgets to prepare a spreadsheet model of potential audit subjects. The purpose of the model is to help prioritize audit work. It compares the following seven factors: proposed FY 2024-25 expenditures, estimated FY 2024-25 revenue, fund type, whether the service is included as a CSA dashboard item or City Council focus area, results from the Annual Community Opinion Survey, audit requests, and date of last audit. The results of the model are attached (see Attachment A).

PROPOSED AUDIT ASSIGNMENTS

The list of proposed audit assignments for FY 2024-25 includes a mix of audits already in process, recurring audits, and additional audit projects that address a range of concerns consistent with the City Auditor's areas of responsibility. The number of projects reflects our current performance target of 1.5 audit projects per auditor.

In December 2020, the City Council directed that the City Auditor's annual work plan include performance audits of at least three constituent-facing departments, the purpose of which should be to identify cost savings and process efficiencies. 1 In addition, audits

of constituent-facing departments should reoccur every four years. This proposed work plan satisfies the City Council's direction, with audits covering programs in the departments of Public Works (Animal Care and Service); Housing; Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services; Transportation; and Police.

Each audit listed includes a tentative, high-level objective that will be refined during the scoping phase of the audit project.

AUDITS IN PROCESS:

- Encumbrances Review encumbrances for compliance with the City's Encumbrance Policy (CPM 5.1.12). The General Fund had a \$53 million Reserve for Encumbrance in the FY 2023-24 Proposed Operating Budget. The FY 2024-25 Proposed Operating Budget, it totaled \$84 million. (Outstanding request from a resident) Target date: Sep-2024.
- 2. **San José Animal Care and Services** Audit covering various aspects of Animal Care and Services' operations and comparisons against industry standards, as directed by the Mayor and multiple Councilmembers. (*Added to the work plan by the Rules Committee on October 11, 2023*) Target date: Oct-2024.
- 3. **Tenant Protection Ordinance** Review the assessment and use of Tenant Protection Ordinance fees. (*Councilmember request*) Target date: Oct-2024.
- 4. Access to and use of critical services by traditionally marginalized communities Assess and provide recommendations related to departmental efforts around progress on Racial Equity Action Plans, resources available for equity-related work, collection of data on participants or parties impacted by services, and/or other related areas. This is intended to be a series of audits covering different City programs and services. The first project's scope is BeautifySJ's neighborhood blight programs within the Department of Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services. (Direction from the Mayor to explore an audit scope in this area in the March 2023 Budget Message) Target date: Nov-2024.

ANNUAL/RECURRING PROJECTS:

- 5. **Semi-annual audit recommendation status reports** (on-going) The City Auditor's Office will maintain an online dashboard of audit recommendations and issue a report on the implementation status of all open audit recommendations as of June 30th and December 31st. Target dates: Sep-2024 and Mar-2025.
- 6. Annual Performance Review of Team San Jose and the Convention and Visitors Bureau (as required in the City's agreements with Team San Jose) Annual review to determine whether Team San Jose met their performance metrics as of June 30, 2024. Target date: Nov-2024.
- 7. **Annual Report on City Services** (on-going) 17th annual report providing data about the cost, quality, quantity, and timeliness of City services. The report

- incorporates existing performance measurement data, showing ten-year historical trends, a variety of comparisons to other cities, and the results of resident surveys. Target date: Dec-2024.
- 8. Annual external financial audit and single audit (contracted audit service) The City Charter requires an annual audit of the City's financial transactions. The independent certified public accounting firm Macias Gini & O'Connell LLP (MGO) will conduct the annual audits of the Annual Comprehensive Financial Reports of the City and the Airport. MGO will also conduct audits of the financial statements of the Successor Agency to the Redevelopment Agency, Convention Center, Deferred Compensation, Tier 3 Defined Contribution Plan, Voluntary Employee Beneficiary Association (VEBA), Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) grant compliance, South Bay Water Recycling, San José Clean Energy (SJCE), and the Single Audit (including Airport passenger facility charges and customer facility charges). Target date: Dec-2024.
- 9. **Annual audits of voter-approved bond and parcel tax measures** (contracted audit service) MGO will conduct audits of the Branch Library Bond Projects Fund, the Parks and Recreation Bond Projects Fund, the Library Parcel Tax Fund, and the Public Safety and Infrastructure ("Measure T") Bond Fund satisfying the City's obligation for guaranteed annual audits. Target date: Oct-2024.
- 10. Semi-annual compliance reviews of the City's investment program (contracted audit service) The City's investment policy requires semi-annual compliance audits of the City's investment portfolio. MGO will conduct the agreed-upon procedures as of June 30th and December 31st. Target dates: Sep-2024 and Mar-2025.
- 11. Compliance review of San José Clean Energy's risk management practices (contracted audit service) MGO will conduct tests of SJCE investment and risk management practices to ensure compliance with the City's Energy Risk Management Policy and Energy Risk Management Regulations as of FY Ended June 30, 2024. Target date: Nov-2024.

CARRYOVER AND NEW PROJECTS:

- 12. **Park in-lieu fees** Assess the collection, tracking, and use of park in-lieu fees. (*Outstanding requests from resident and former Mayor*)
- 13. **Police overtime follow up report** Assess controls around overtime in the Police Department. This is a follow up to the City Auditor's 2016 Police Overtime and 2021 Police Staffing, Expenditures, and Workload audits. (*Outstanding audit request*)
- 14. <NEW> Access to and use of critical services by traditionally marginalized communities The second project in this series will focus on Traffic Safety programs or services in the Increasing Community Safety City Council focus area. (See project 4 above)

- 15. **<NEW> Homelessness –** Audit to explore the City's internal department structure related to homelessness response, including assessing coordination of activities and benchmarking with other jurisdictions. (*Per City Council direction at the June 11, 2024 City Council meeting*)
- 16. **<NEW> Procurement** Assess the efficiency of the City's procurement processes for goods and services, not including public works projects. (Outstanding audit requests from a Councilmember and the Mayor)
- 17. **<NEW> City costs for special events** Assess City-required security or other costs to organizers for special events. (*Request from the Mayor*)

PROJECTS CONSIDERED BUT NOT RECOMMENDED AT THIS TIME:

We designed the above list of projects to address high priority areas, while limiting the scope of work to what we can realistically accomplish. Additional items considered but not recommended include the following topics. Each have outstanding audit requests and/or score high on the Citywide risk assessment.

- 1. 311 service delivery and tracking
- 2. Affordable housing NOFA process
- 3. Citywide contracting
- 4. Digital equity performance measurement
- 5. Environmental services planning around critical infrastructure/emergency management
- 6. Fire emergency response
- 7. Fire recruitment and retention
- 8. Performance measure reviews (proposed in prior years as an ongoing project, propose postponing as City Manager's Office completes its work reviewing and revising performance measures in the Adopted Operating Budget)
- 9. Police Department use of non-sworn staff
- 10. Procurement Public Works projects
- 11. Public records requests
- 12. Traffic signal and streetlight maintenance (originally included in prior year work plan but dropped because of the addition of different priority projects)
- 13. Transportation-related development fees
- 14. Vehicle abatement (follow up to 2018 audit)

As part of our normal audit process, we will notify Councilmembers when we start each audit to determine if there are any interests or concerns that we can address during our audit. This is intended to ensure that our audits are responsive to your needs. Any subsequent additions to the work plan will be forwarded to the Rules and Open Government Committee for approval. Generally, audit reports are heard by the appropriate City Council Committee and then cross-referenced to the full City Council for acceptance.
