Action: Upon motion by Acting Police Chief Paul Joseph, second by Mayor Matt Mahan, item was unanimously approved by all present. The Emergency Services Council unanimously approved and accepted the proposed modifications to the City of San José Emergency Management Ordinance, Municipal Code 8.08 and requested the Emergency Management Ordinance be forwarded to City Council for adoption.

B. Emergency Operations Plan – Base Plan

- A. How organizations with the SJ Arena Authority and Team San Jose would be incorporated into the City's Emergency Operations Plan
- B. Why there are no primary or support roles currently listed for the AFN Coordinator or the Volunteer Unit
- C. Would there be a consideration to re-word "compassionate action" under guiding principles.

Dennis King (Hispanic Chamber of Commerce Silicon Valley) posed a question on how public members would know how to identify official city volunteers (CERT members/Disaster Service Workers- Volunteers) and know they are here to help them.
