






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# Countywide Trails Master Plan (1995)



**Vision:** “[P]roviding a network of trails that connects cities to one another, connects cities to the County’s regional open space resources, connects County parks to County parks, and connects the northern and southern urbanized regions of the County...”



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# Key Concepts Refresher

## What the Plan Is

- ▶ Trails of countywide significance
- ▶ High-level route concepts & goals for trail connectivity
- ▶ Emphasizes use of public lands
- ▶ Part of County General Plan & guide for County's work on trails
- ▶ Planning tool for coordination between jurisdictions
- ▶ Sets countywide trail priorities in unincorporated areas

## What the Plan Is Not

- ▶ Not all trails existing or planned in County
- ▶ Not specific trail alignments or designs
- ▶ Not an acquisition plan
- ▶ Not a trail guide to use on a hike or ride
- ▶ Does not pre-empt local trail plans
- ▶ Does not set trail priorities for cities



# Resource Protection and the CWTMP

- ▶ Parks Department mission includes preservation and protection
- ▶ CWTMP: over-arching policies and guidelines, **not** on-the-ground alignments or buildable designs
- ▶ Protection of natural & cultural resources is a stated priority in CWTMP
- ▶ Site-specific conditions & potential impacts would determine selection of on-the-ground alignments and designs


This map is intended to be used only as a planning tool. It depicts only regionally significant existing and potential future trails. It does not include all trails in Santa Clara County.

The undeveloped potential trail routes shown on this map are conceptual and generalized; they should not be considered real or buildable alignments as shown. Final on-the-ground trail routes would be determined through further planning. Responsibility for detailed design, environmental compliance, and construction of each individual trail is determined by jurisdiction. Within the County, trail alignments would be developed pursuant to the trail implementation recommendations set forth in the Santa Clara County General Plan, including site-specific considerations related to land rights and uses, environmental resources, tribal and cultural resources, and other factors.

Many of the routes and staging areas identified on the map are proposed only in concept and are not currently developed or open to the public for any purpose. **This map does not convey any rights to the public to use any undeveloped trail routes shown here; nor is it meant to encourage access in or across any land not currently open to the public.** This map does not exempt any person from trespassing charges. For copies of maps about existing trails that are available for public use, contact the Santa Clara County Parks and Recreation Department or other relevant local jurisdictions.

Where there is a specific interest or consent expressed by a willing property owner/owner/lessor, trails in areas with prime agricultural lands shall be developed in a manner that avoids any significant impact to the agricultural productivity of those lands.
- PR-TS.2.4 Trail Routes or Regional Staging Areas shown on the Countywide Trails Master Plan Map in areas currently designated as Ranchland on the County General Plan Land Use Map and actively used for ranching or other agricultural purposes shall not be required (including easements) or developed outside of County road rights-of-way until or unless: (1) the County is notified of a non-renewal of Williamson Act contract affecting the land on which the trail route or regional staging area would be located; (2) such time as the active ranching and/or agricultural use has been permanently abandoned; (3) the land use designation is amended to a non-ranchland designation, or (4) there is specific interest or consent expressed by a willing property owner/owner/lessor.
- PR-TS.2.5 Trail Routes or Regional Staging Areas shown on the Countywide Trails Master Plan Map in areas currently designated as Hillside on the County General Plan Land Use Map and actively used for ranching or other agricultural purposes shall not be required (including easements) or developed outside of County road rights-of-way until or unless: (1) the County is notified of a non-renewal of Williamson Act contract affecting the land on which the trail route or regional staging area would be located; (2) such time as active ranching and/or agricultural use has been permanently abandoned; or (3) there is specific interest or consent expressed by a willing property owner/owner/lessor.








Survey Results - Trails Most Needed (Top 5 Priorities)




Connection of Diablo Foothills Preserve into trail network






