<a href="#">Rebuilding Together</a>	<a href="#">Minor Repair</a>	\$750,000	This project provides repairs for single-family and mobile home housing units to attend to immediate health and safety needs for extremely low-income homeowners in San Jose. The focus of repairs is to address emergency and critical repair needs, as well as minor accessibility and mobility needs within the home.
<a href="#">Catholic Charities of Santa Clara County</a>	<a href="#">Senior Isolation to Inclusion Project</a>	\$100,650	This project provides a continuum of community-based safety net services - including licensed adult day care, escorted transportation, and congregate senior meals - to San Jose's low-income, dependent seniors in order to prevent or reduce their isolation and depression, and to increase their community connections.
<a href="#">The Health Trust</a>	<a href="#">Meals On Wheels</a>	\$100,650	The Meals on Wheels program provides hot meals Monday-Friday to senior participants. In addition, services include providing personal connections to those seniors without family or friends nearby. MOW drivers provide wellness checks with each delivery.
<a href="#">San Jose Streets Team (SJST)</a>	Encampment & <a href="#">Place-Based Cleanup Project</a>	\$750,000	The primary purpose of the EPBC project is threefold: 1) to remove trash and other debris in homeless encampments and in three San José neighborhoods; 2) to provide project participants with outreach case management, employment development services, job training, and housing placement assistance; and 3) to place individuals into permanent jobs.
<a href="#">HomeFirst</a>	<a href="#">Citywide Outreach &amp; Shelter Project</a>	\$625,000	The primary purpose of the project is threefold: 1. To provide a consistent presence on the streets and other outdoor locations throughout San José to build rapport and trust with unsheltered homeless residents with the goal of moving them into and keeping them in permanent housing; 2. To provide street-based case management to the unhoused population and: 3. To provide an avenue to alleviate resident concerns about encampments and homeless residents living in their neighborhoods or other areas of San José.

The primary purpose of the project is to build community ownership in the Santee neighborhood through services provided by Grantee.

The primary purpose of the project is to expand the resident-based leadership in neighborhoods in San Jose's Council District 3.
