Cardboard Works as a Weed Barrier





Question:

What other kinds of barriers can be used in your yard?

These gardens use a layer of cardboard underneath the woodchips to help prevent weed growth.

This technique is called **sheet mulching**. It covers the ground with a biodegradable material, such as cardboard, followed by layers of organic material to enrich soil and prevent weeds.

Sheet Mulching Basic Steps:

- 1. Remove weeds and invasive plants a much as possible. Knock down and lay flat any tall weeds or unwanted woody plants.
- 2. Lay down a covering of your choice of materials: used cardboard, newspaper (five or six sheets deep), old cotton rags, or carpet made from natural fibers. Plastic sheeting is *not* a good choice because it's *not* biodegradable.
- 3. Cut slits in this layer for plants.
- **4.** Top with layers of compost and three to six inches of mulch.
