# Survey of Artists' Space Needs in San Jose


**Primary goal:** To determine the need for affordable housing for artists in San Jose.

Other goals: To identify desired space/design needs for artists.

To identify cross-population in the artist community and particular categories of the homeless community (imminent risk, episodic, transitional/situational). 414 artists and creatives completed the survey, conducted August through September 2016.


## Q31 Please tell us about yourself. What is your age?


### Q40 On average, how many hours per week do you spend on your artistic activity (including planning, creation, training and the business side of art)?

Answered: 303 Skipped: 111




# Q39 What percentage of your income comes from your art or creative work? (not the household's income)

Answered: 303 Skipped: 111




# Q20 Which of the following options would you consider for an affordable housing community that you would relocate to? (Select all that apply)


# Q2 Do you currently have work space you use only for your art or creative work? (i.e., space for creation, rehearsal, etc.)


## Q6 Are you concerned about future displacement from your studio/work space?


# Q7 Please tell us more about your concerns of future displacement from your studio/work space. (Select all that apply)


## Q10 Do you currently own or rent/lease your living space?


## Q11 Since you do not rent/lease or own, what is your current housing situation?


# Q13 Please tell us more about your concerns of being displaced from your housing. (Select all that apply)


# Q16 What do you currently pay monthly, on average, for your housing, NOT including utilities? (e.g., your monthly rent or mortgage payment)


# Q24 What is the maximum amount you would consider paying monthly (NOT including utilities) for your housing or live/work space?


## Q25 How many bedrooms does your household need?


# Q27 Please tell us about your preference for studio/creative work space. What is the min. square footage necessary?

### Feedback from Artspace

Based on number of artists indicating interest in affordable live/work space, the survey recommends up to 64 artist housing units in San Jose.

Strong indication of a high risk of displacement (both housing and studio/work space).

Majority of respondents currently live in San Jose. New spaces would predominately serve local artists.

### Feedback from Artspace

Since many artists are interested in combined live/work space, new housing units should be larger than you might typically find in an affordable housing project and space should be designed flexibly.

Artspace units – approx. 150sf larger than those typically available in the market.

60% of the artists surveyed would be satisfied with working space that is 500sf or less, which should be achievable in most units.

### **Next Steps**

- ➤OCA, Housing Dept., developer and Artspace meet to discuss survey findings, timeline & action items needed to move forward on the project.
- Information update to survey participants once timeline & project site are confirmed.
