OF REFERENDUM PETITION TO

REPEAL ORDINANCE 28960

DATE: January 4, 2012

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. Place on the City Council January 10, 2012 Agenda the acceptance of the Certificate of Sufficiency issued by the County of Santa Clara Registrar of Voters regarding the referendum to repeal Ordinance 28960.
- 2. Refer to staff further analysis and the development of options for City Council action no later than March 6, 2012 to either a) repeal Ordinance 28960 or b) call a municipal election.

OUTCOME

The Santa Clara County Registrar of Voters has certified the petition to repeal Ordinance 28960 to be sufficient. The Council's options for action are to: a) repeal Ordinance 28960; or b) adopt a resolution calling a Municipal Election on the issue.

BACKGROUND

Based on the latest report to the California Secretary of State, there are 370,666 registered voters within San Jose. City Charter Section 1603 (b) requires that a referendum petition be signed by at least 8% of the total number of eligible registered voters, which means that 29,653 valid signatures are necessary for a referendum to qualify for action.

On October 28, 2011, the proponents of a referendum petition regarding the repeal of Ordinance 28960 submitted 49,224 signatures on 2,224 sections calling on the City Council to repeal the ordinance or to submit the Ordinance to a vote of the people pursuant to San Jose City Charter Section 1603 (b) and California Elections Code 9241. The Office of the City Clerk conducted a prima facie review and raw count of the petition and determined that there appeared to be a sufficient number of signatures to proceed.

The petition was transferred to the County of Santa Clara Registrar of Voters (ROV) on October 31, 2011 for signature verification. Consistent with California Elections Code Section 9115, the Registrar of Voters performed a random sample of three-percent (3%) of the signatures submitted. From this examination, it was determined that the results of the sample fell within the range which required the Registrar to complete the verification of every signature submitted to determine if there were sufficient signatures to qualify the referendum.

On January 3, 2011, the Registrar provided the attached certification that the referendum proponents have successfully gathered a sufficient number of signatures to qualify the measure for Council action. The Registrar reports that of the 49,224 signatures obtained, 31,103 are valid and the referendum has qualified.

<u>ANALYSIS</u>

Under the Elections Code, the Council may place the item on the ballot or the Council may rescind the Ordinance in question. If the City Council does not repeal the ordinance in its entirety, then Elections Code Section 9241 requires that the City Council submit the ordinance to the voters either at the next regular municipal election or at a special election called for that purpose. The referendum election must be held not less than 88 days from the call of the election. If the Council decides to place the measure on the ballot, I recommend that it be submitted to the voters at the June 5, 2012 Primary Election. The deadline to submit Resolutions to the ROV for measures on the June 2012 ballot is March 9.

If an election were to be called, the City Council would need to adopt a Resolution. The Resolution would request that the election be consolidated with any other elections taking place in the County since – at a minimum - other City elections will already be on the June 2012 ballot. Specifically, the Council has previously adopted resolutions

calling for elections in Council Districts 2, 4, 6, 8, and 10 and the pension reform Charter amendment. This would be the most cost-effective approach if the referendum was submitted to the electorate.

COST SUMMARY/IMPLICATIONS

Estimated costs for the June 5, 2012 elections are: \$445,000 for the City Council seats; the first city-wide measure is estimated at \$607,000; and \$401,000 for the second and each subsequent measure. Sufficient funds are currently appropriated in the FY 2011-12 Budget to cover these projected costs.

Dear Mr. Hawkins,

The initiative petition submitted to our office on October 31, 2011 contained 49,224 signatures. Based on the registered voters in San Jose as of the last report of registration to the Secretary of State (Elections Code Sections 2187 & 9237), the petition needed 29,653 valid signatures to be found sufficient.

Per Election Code Section 9115(a), the Registrar of Voters performed an examination of the random sampling of 1,477 signatures, of which 986 signatures were found valid. The petition had a projected number of 30,070 valid signatures, which is 103.5% of the number of valid signatures required to pass.

Per EC 9115(b), "if the statistical sampling of valid signatures shows that the number of valid signatures was within 95 to 110 percent of the number of signatures of qualified voters needed to declare the petition sufficient, the elections official shall, within 60 days from the date of the filing of the petition, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, examine and verify each signature filed."

The Office of the Registrar of Voters has completed an examination and verification of each signature submitted by your city. Of the 49,224 signatures submitted to our office, 31,103 were found vaild. Attached are Clerks Certificate to Referendum Petition and the Petition Result Breakdown with statistical details.
