District 5 is one of the most park-poor districts in the city with very limited options for our residents to enjoy and play.



In a time when our families are facing issues such as obesity, diabetes and other very familiar health issues common to disadvantaged communities, it is important to work together as a community and preserve as much of our open space and recreational activities as we possibly can.

With that said, I hope you take the time to attend our November 17th Council meeting at 7:00pm where the Mayor and Council will give direction to staff on the future of these courses and whether or not they will remain open space or possibly sold for development.

I hope you will stand with me in preserving one of the few open space and recreational options we have left in District 5.


Sweet Passions Bakery

Our office is working with PAL and the San Jose Police Department to put together a turkey giveaway for 250 families who would find it difficult to buy one. VivaCalle: A huge success!

Thank you to the planning and implementation team in our Parks, Recreation and Neighborhood Services Department staff. VivaCalle was a great success!

VivaCalle was started in Bogota, Colombia and has spread all over the world. The Open Streets Project now has more than 100 documented initiatives in North America including San Francisco and Los Angeles. These events are becoming more common in cities seeking innovative ways to promote environmental, social, economic, and public health goals.



The inaugural "Downtown to Eastbound" route was held Sunday, October 11th, with 6 miles of San José roads closed off to vehicular traffic. For one Sunday afternoon families walked, biked, skated, and ran the streets of San José.

The event featured live music, food trucks, bike repair stations, hydration stations, and much more. VivaCalleSJ exposed small businesses to residents and connected neighbors who otherwise would not have had the chance to engage with their community. By closing one of the busiest roads, Story road, we put people over cars. As we try to make this an annual event, we should remember VivaCalleSJ not only brings residents together but also keeps cars off the roads, which is better for the environment.





Addressing Illegal Dumping

Many of you have noticed that illegal dumping has been a severe problem throughout San José, particularly in East San José. Although we have held dozens of dumpster and clean up days there always seems to be more. The City Council and I have implemented new rules in hopes of reducing illegal dumping. Fines have been established starting with \$2,500 for the first violation, increasing to \$5,000 for the second violation and finally \$10,000 for three or more violations. Additionally, I directed City staff to make reporting of illegal dumping online easier. The city website will be made interactive, similar to the report abandoned

vehicles tool available online. City staff will also be implementing a new cell phone application, available next year. Lastly, I would like to refresh everyone's memory by mentioning San Jose currently offers one **3-large item pick up** for free. If you have more items to dispose of, any additional 3-large item pick up will cost only \$27.

Valley Transit Authority's <u>New</u> Alum Rock Office Opens

There's a new addition to the store fronts on Alum Rock Avenue - the Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) Bus Rapid Transit Project office.

The office, located at 1592 Alum Rock Ave, opened its doors on Monday, October 26 and will remain open for at least 1 year during the construction phase.



Office hours run from 10am-4pm, Monday through Friday, with extended hours on Wednesdays until 7:30pm.

VTA decided to open this office to allow business owners, residents, and anyone who has questions about the project, construction, plans, or VTA to come in and ask. In addition, the new San José -hired Administrator, will be stationed out of this office to make him easily accessible for the business owners whose cases he will be reviewing.
