The Contractor will break ground on the first phase of the 31st Street and Alum Rock Park with the help of Senator Jim Beall. Our beloved Plata Arroyo Park is currently undergoing renovations and will be completed this year. Safety improvements are being made to the crosswalks and pedestrian, and bike-friendly improvements are moving forward along King Road.

This year we passed an increase to the Minimum Wage, which will increase the wage to \$15 by 2019. As a council, we worked with community advocates and home gardeners to allow for Urban Agricultural Incentives Zones. The new areas will provide a property tax break for property owners who allow farming on small parcels. I hope to see the first few in my district this year and get our hands in the dirt to make our blighted parcels come to life. The voters passed Measure F which will enable us to begin to bring back our police officers to sustainable numbers. Also, we passed Measure A which will provide much-needed services for homeless families and put shovels in the ground to build affordable housing and provide first-time homebuyer programs.

Highway Trash Relief Coming Soon

As we embark on a new year, we would like to commend the collaboration between those at the city and state level in their efforts to find solutions towards keeping our freeways clean, safe, and free of blight. Caltrans has just announced that they will be partnering with the San Jose Conservation Corps to create more maintenance crews to service our roads. We have been listening to our community about blight, trash, and graffiti along our freeways and here is our answer. The increased staffing through the San Jose Conservation will allow Caltrans to conduct more abatements and cleanups in San Jose

and the rest of Santa Clara County.

Other programs are also being put in place towards addressing these issues. In regards to graffiti, Caltrans restored its contract with Graffiti Protective Coatings (GPC) to help erase graffiti throughout our freeways. Surely this partnering will make it more possible to tend to and maintain the quality of our freeways throughout San Jose. A special thanks goes out to Senator Jim Beall for his




leadership on this matter as well, given that that Caltrans is monitored on a state level, his leadership and collaboration goes a long way in creating graffiti free, safe roads for San Jose residents. From the 101, 280, 680, 85, 87, these freeways surround our city and many are very close to commercial and residential areas so they need to be in safe, quality conditions. We look forward to seeing this partnership contribute to quality of Caltrans regulated freeways in San Jose and throughout Santa Clara County.

FREE LARGE ITEM PICKUPS

Residents have the opportunity to request FREE curbside large item pickups. Single family homes are allowed up to 2 large item pickups. This is the perfect opportunity for residents to get rid of large bulky items such as mattresses, furniture, refrigerators, etc. All pickups must be arranged through your recycling collections company. If you are unsure what company that is, please use the <u>Residential Services Lookup</u>.

Apartments & Condos

Apartment and condominium residents with communal garbage dumpster service can contact their property managers to arrange for free large item collections.



Recycling your large items keeps them out of the landfill and helps San José achieve its Zero Waste goal and keeps our neighborhoods clean.

What to do with your Christmas tree?

It is simple. Curbside collection of Christmas trees is on your collection day beginning December 26, 2016 through January 27, 2017. Remove stands, tinsel, and decorations. Cut into 5-foot pieces. Set out on the curb near your carts by 6:00 a.m.
