Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals

I am heartbroken and furious of the decision of the President to end the protections to the children of immigrants who were under the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program. I wanted to share some important information regarding the program from the campaign we are here to stay.

Here are the top 5 things to know about his announcement:

1. Your DACA is valid until its expiration date. DACA and work permits (Employment Authorization Documents) will remain valid until its expiration date. To determine when your DACA and work permit expires,

look at your I-795 Approval Notice and the bottom of your Employment Authorization Document (EAD).

2. No new DACA applications will be accepted. United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) no longer will accept or process first-time applications after September 5, 2017.

3. DACA issuances and work permits expiring between now and March 5, 2018 must be submitted for renewal by October 5, 2017.

If you have a permit that will expire between now and March 5, 2018, you must apply for a two-year renewal of your DACA by Oct 5th.

4. Advance Parole to travel abroad is no longer available.

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) will no longer grant DACA recipients permission to travel abroad through Advance Parole. Any pending applications for advance parole will not be processed and DHS will refund any associated fees.

5. We are united in this fight.

You are not alone. We mobilized, organized, and marched five years ago for DACA, and we will continue to do everything in our power to protect immigrant youth and their families across the country.

While we are saddened by this decision,. We must mobilize. I hope you will join me in lobbying our congressional leaders to come to an agreement that does not fail 800,000 people and their families.


