## ABOUT THE PROJECT

Almaden Sphere is a celestial shower of light and color suspended from a web of stainless steel cables in the entry lobby of the Almaden Community Center and Library. It is a modern interpretation of the tradition of grand crystal chandeliers that adorned great halls. It is designed to interact with both the natural sunlight and the interior lights to add a dramatic design element in the main hub of the building.

Comprised of 5,000 dichroic glass prisms *Sphere* measures 18' diameter and 23' high and weighs approximately 800 pounds.

The artist desired to create a sculpture that evokes a sense of fascination, stimulation, beauty, contemplation, and intrigue.

## ABOUT THE ARTIST

Ray King is an accomplished artist who uses the natural phenomena of light as it interacts with glass and optics as an art medium. By creating dynamic interactions with the sun and refracting light colors,

His work has been commissioned by universities, municipalities and private patrons throughout the world. His glass creations have been exhibited at the Museum of Contemporary Crafts in New York, the Renwick Gallery of the Smithsonian Institute, the Hokkaido Museum of Modern Art in Sapporo, Japan, and other venues throughout America and Europe.
