## **ABOUT THE PROJECT**



The artwork is located on the corrugated metal façade of the Ice Center. The design includes the word "ICE" painted directly onto the wall in large, colorful letters that span the 26 foot high façade and create a vivid backdrop to the 7 aluminum figures, painted in brilliant colors and reflecting San Jose's cultural diversity. These figures range in height from 15 - 18 feet, and illustrate the fun and excitement of ice skating. The artwork spans the 168 foot long façade.

JoeSam reached out to the community by working with a Franklin Elementary School 5<sup>th</sup> grade class. He led them in an art project that involved creating colorful and inventive "ice skates" out of old shoes, and encouraged them to write stories about their skates. He also took them on an ice skating trip to the Ice Center and sketched their movements on the ice as reference for the project.

The 7 figures on the wall represent different forms of ice skating. The figures are ice dancing, skating and playing hockey. Two of the figures represent enthusiastic spectators. JoeSam stated that this piece is about warmth, color, and humor as seen through these playful figures.
