CLASS SUMMARY:

Supervises environmental Inspectors and ensures compliance with local, state, and federal environmental protection programs.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS:

The Environmental Inspector, Senior is the fourth in the four level environmental inspection series, and is responsible for supervising the other three levels. The Environmental Inspector, Senior is distinguished from the Environmental Inspector II by its responsibility of leading or managing projects as well as having full supervisory authority.

QUALIFICATIONS

(These qualifications are typically required. An equivalent combination of education, experience, knowledge, skills, and abilities sufficient to satisfactorily perform the duties of the job may be substituted.)

Education and Experience:

Bachelor's Degree in Environmental Science, Biology, Chemistry, or a closely related field, including two semesters (or equivalent quarter units) of college level chemistry and four (4) years of laboratory, hazardous materials, process control experience, or environmental inspection; including two years of lead or project management experience; or, an equivalent combination of education and experience sufficient to successfully perform the essential duties of the job such as those listed above.

Licensing Requirements:

- Valid California driver's license
- Ability to obtain an Environmental Compliance Inspector Grade III Certification or Hazardous Materials Inspection Certification may be required.

Minimum Knowledge, Skills and Abilities (position requirements at entry and depending on area of assignment):

- Knowledge of principles and practices of supervision.
- Knowledge of the effects of toxic pollutants in the sewer and storm collection systems, and the water pollution control plant.
- Knowledge of Health & Safety issues
- Knowledge of emergency procedures involved in chemical spills.
- Knowledge of inspection methods, sample, taking, and testing procedures.
- Knowledge of computer programs related to source control and storm water inspection programs.
- Ability to prepare clear and concise reports and to present them effectively both orally and in writing
- Ability to deal tactfully with the public, industrial and representatives of the tributary agencies, and with the State and Federal officials.

Desirable Qualifications (likely to contribute to more successful job performance; can often be learned on the job):

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- Knowledge of industrial waste pollution control principles and pollution prevention strategies.
- Knowledge of Federal and State regulations governing industrial wastewater and stormwater discharges and related regulations.
- Knowledge of industrial processes and state-of-the-art pretreatment systems.
- Knowledge of stormwater inspections of facilities and the handling of illegal discharges into the storm collection system.
- Ability to perform complex inspections of industries.
- Ability to supervise and train staff in professional and technical aspects of industrial waste source control

Light Work: Exerting up to 20 pounds of force occasionally, and/or up to 10 pounds of force frequently, and/or a negligible amount of force constantly to move objects. If the use of arm and/or leg controls requires exertion of forces greater than that for Sedentary Work and the worker sits most of the time, the job is rated for Light Work.
