PAINTER, WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PLANT (3124)

CLASS PURPOSE

Under general supervision, performs journey level painting work of moderate difficulty in the preservation and beautification of the Water Pollution Control Plant facilities and equipment. Performs related work as required.

TYPICAL DUTIES AND RESULTS (Any one position may not include all the duties listed, nor do the examples cover all the duties which may be performed.)

Cleans and prepares surfaces to be painted by use of sandblaster, steam cleaner, sandpaper, steel wool, scrapers, soap and water, and wire wheels.

Paints, varnishes, lacquers, stains, and shellacs, walls (interior and exterior), ceilings, desks, cabinets, moldings, floors, piping systems, machinery, and equipment.

Uses brushes, spray guns, and other painting tools and implements.

Mixes paints, varnishes, shellacs, enamels, lacquers, epoxys, chlorinated rubber, and 4 part epoxy caulking.

Cleans, stores, and keeps painting equipment and tools in good condition.

Erects and moves scaffolds, ladders and planking.

May operate pick-up truck, fork lift, power hoist, etc.

Lifts and moves furniture, machinery, equipment, and other objects.

Prepares requisition forms and orders supplies.

DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS

This is the journey level painter of the Painter series assigned to the Water Pollution Control Plant. This class differs from Senior Painter, Water Pollution Control Plant, in that the latter class has responsibility for scheduling, assigning, and reviewing the work of other journey level painters.

QUALIFICATIONS

Minimum Knowledges, Skills, and Abilities

Knowledge of painting preparation criteria, and methods.

Knowledge of painting methods and techniques.

Knowledge of paint compounds and mixing techniques.

Knowledge of taping and texturing.

Knowledge of lacquers and epoxy compounds.

Ability to follow oral and written instructions.

Ability to lift heavy weights 20-100 pounds.

Competency Knowledges, Skills, and Abilities

Knowledge of training principles.

Ability to work in a safe manner.

Ability to train apprentice painters and other employees.

Ability to work with special protective coatings and toxic solvents.

Training and Experience

Any combination of training and experience equivalent to successful completion of a recognized painter apprenticeship program.

Licenses/Certificates

Possession of a valid California driver's license.
