SUBJECT: Concept and Design Development proposal by Morgan Bricca for the Havana Drive at Midfield Avenue mural project.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the concept and design development proposal by artist Morgan Bricca for a mural project at the intersection of Havana Drive and Midfield Avenue.

DATE OF ARTIST SELECTION: Tuesday, March 6, 2018

ARTWORK BUDGET: \$75,000, including a contingency of \$6,375 that will not be paid to artist except to address specific, unanticipated issues that may arise.

LOCATION: The project site is the soundwall at the intersection of Havana Drive and Midfield Avenue.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Members of the community initiated this mural project to enhance a vacant site at the juncture of Havana Drive and Midfield Avenue and to help reduce graffiti. There has been considerable community interest in developing the site into a neighborhood pocket park however, as the site is owned by CalTrans, those plans are presently on hold. The community has a very strong interest in the public benefit that a mural on the adjacent wall will bring to their neighborhood.

In conjunction with the Office of Councilmember Tam Nguyen a neighborhood review panel was put together to select an artist to be contracted to complete the mural. The review panel was comprised of seven community members and an artist who also lives in Council District 7.

Artist Morgan Bricca was selected by the Artist Selection Panel from 14 artists who are in the the Public Art Program's Pre-Qualified Mural Artist Roster.

Ms Bricca is proposing a mural design that incorporates themes identified in meetings with community members. The themes reflect the community's interest in something that was both beautiful and inspiring, and that would reflect positively on youth in the area and, if possible, might reference aspects of their history. Her design takes into consideration the varied textural surface of the wall, with its alternating smooth and roughly textured "panels".
