





Key Hardscape Investments and Safe Intersections











- 2018 Protected Bikeways

Strategy: Parking protection for existing bike lanes. Physical separation. Design intersections for safe turning and transit boarding.

- San Salvador Street


Strategy: Traffic calming, traffic diversion, wayfinding.




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
