### 1. ROLL CALL

# 5. <u>REPORTS</u>

A. <u>Memorandum</u>: Report and discussion on City of San Jose Procurement Reforms and the application of the City's local and small business preference to procurements for the WPCP.

Walter Rossmann, Chief Procurement Officer for the City of San Jose appeared before the Committee. Under the Reports section of the agenda, he

provided an overview of the procurement process reforms that the San Jose City Council will be considering. Walter was seeking conceptual concurrence of TPAC. These changes had been discussed in concept in a previous TAC/TPAC cycle. He will return with specific recommendations to TPAC in August 2006.

The key changes include increasing the City of San Jose's Administration's approval authority for most types of procurement actions from \$100,000 to \$1,000,000. Currently City Council action is required for those items.

Previously TAC/TPAC expressed some concern of needing to be informed of those actions. Walter will develop a reporting mechanism for use by the Finance and other San Jose city departments to keep TAC/TPAC informed of design and engineering consultant contracts for contract amounts between \$100,000 and \$1,000,000 before they are approved administratively.

The second major change for which TPAC's concurrence was sought was whether to expand San Jose's Local and Small Business Preference Policy to Trib Agency funded procurements. The Policy would provide a price preference regarding bids and a points preference on RFPs for businesses geographically located in Santa Clara County as well as a separate preference for small businesses.

TPAC was favorable to this idea as well. Walter will return to TPAC for official action.

Motion unanimously accepted by the TPAC Committee.

  - (b) Decrease the Ending Fund Balance by \$130,000.
- 3. Report on bids and award of contract for Part 1: and rejection of bids for Part 2 of the design-build project entitled, "San Jose/Santa Clara Water Pollution Control Plant, Fiscal Year 2005-2006 Capital Improvement Program,

Reliability Improvement for Switchgear S2/S2A & M3/M4 Project," to the sole bidder, Rosendin Electric, Inc., in the amount of \$609,400; and approval of a budget contingency in the amount of \$60,000.

- Approval of an agreement with Santa Clara Valley Water District for cost sharing associated with implementation of water conservation programs in FY 2006-2007, under which the City will receive an amount not to exceed \$280,000 from Santa Clara Valley Water District and Santa Clara Valley Water District will be paid an amount not to exceed \$479,821 by the City, for a net cost to the City of \$199,821.
- 3. Approval of award of open purchase orders for supplies, materials, equipment and services for FY 2006-2007 #1 and authorization for the Director of Finance to execute the purchase orders.
