CLEAN CREEKS, HEALTHY COMMUNITIES SUMMER 2 0 1 4 **CLEAN CREEKS COURIER** HOMELESSNESS IN COYOTE CREEK ADDRESSED THIS ISSUE

On a per capita basis, San José has one of the largest unsheltered populations of any major city in the United States. The 2013 biennial homeless census and survey counted 4,770 homeless individuals in San José – an 18% increase from 2011. About 77% of the homeless population live unsheltered along creeks, in vehicles, or on the street and 26%, 1,230 individuals, live in encampments. According to the 2013 survey, 91% of people in encampments reported living in San José at the time they lost their housing. Moreover, 96%





stated that they would willingly accept permanent housing over encampment living. The City has identified 247 distinct encampments of varying size in San José with 66 identified adjacent to waterways, dispersed primarily along Coyote Creek.

In recognition that homeless encampments impact the health and safety of the inhabitants, the environment, and businesses and residents in the surrounding neighborhoods, the City spent \$2 million in the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 budget and will spend an additional \$2 million in Fiscal Year 2014-2015 for a pilot program to house homeless individuals from encampments. Unlike previous efforts that simply cleaned sites only to see homeless individuals return shortly after, this new effort will attempt to permanently keep targeted areas free from encampments.

After assessing several potential sites, the City's Homelessness Response Team selected the large encampment off Story Road and Remillard Court for the project. The goal of the project is to close the targeted encampment by providing supportive housing and implementing site remediation measures. The project, through City and partner funding, will seek to house and employ up to 200 homeless individuals.

Staff has already implemented a number of re-encampment prevention measures, and plans to install gates to block access to the site are also in place. The goal is to clear out the Story Road/Remillard Court encampment by December 2014. To date, 67 individuals have been housed from the site.

QUARTER UPDATES



CCHC has been incredibly busy this past quarter as staff started new outreach initiatives and laid out visions for 6 exciting, new community art projects.

To date, 73 outreach events and 52 volunteer creek and neighborhood cleanup events have been organized. Volunteers have donated 2,427 hours and removed 256 cubic yards of trash and debris from Coyote Creek.

CCHC installed a new swing gate at Galveston Avenue near Summerside Drive. This is the third gate CCHC has installed to prevent illegal dumping. Since installation, there have been no reports of dumping in this area!

CCHC is planning to install a fourth gate later this year in coordination with the City's Parks, Recreation, and Neighborhood Services Department.
