- In Vietnamese, the word nước translates to water, nhà translates to home, and both words translate to country. When you remove nước from the Southeast Asian body, what's left is our salt stained skin—a reminder that we've crossed oceans to leave the nước that nourished us, the nước that was our livelihood, and the nước nhà we once called home.
- Salt Stained: HOME embraces interpretations of "home" from young, Southeast Asian artists. Home is the place we come back to, the place we miss when we leave, and the place we return to for comfort.






Student at San Jose State University, Major: Graphics Design Won First Place at East Side Union School Photography Contest
