RECOMMENDATION

Approve the Team San Jose performance and incentive measures for Fiscal Year 2019-2020.

BACKGROUND

In 2014, the City of San José and Team San Jose (TSJ), which manages the City's convention facilities and four other cultural facilities, entered into a new five-year agreement with two additional five-year options.¹

The agreement requires TSJ to submit its annual targets for the following performance measures to be weighted as follows: Economic Impact Measures 40%, Gross Operating Revenue 40%, Theatre Performance 10%, and Customer Service Survey Results 10%. Based on TSJ's achievement of separate but related incentive fee measures, consistent with the City Auditor's analysis, TSJ will receive an Incentive Fee in 2019-2020. Per contract, the annual Incentive Fee will increase to \$250,000 for the next five-year term. In recent years, the performance measures for TSJ have been brought forward through the Manager's Budget Addendum (MBA) process and ultimately approved as part of the Mayor's June Budget Message.

In 2017, Council approved revisions to TSJ's performance measures to align with national best practices. This MBA reflects the revised measures.

¹ The City's Convention Center and Cultural Facilities Management Agreement and Convention and Visitor Bureau Agreement with TSJ include two automatic five-year extensions that do not require Council action. The contracts will automatically extend beginning in 2019-2020 per the existing terms. However, the City and TSJ are currently negotiating specific terms for contract renewal, and the Administration will recommend amendments for Council approval when that process has completed.

ANALYSIS

The purpose of the performance measures is to provide a quantifiable way of evaluating TSJ's management of the convention facilities. The purpose of the incentive fee measures is to provide a quantifiable way of validating the Incentive Fee earned by TSJ, and paid from the Convention and Cultural Affairs Fund. The performance measures and incentive fee measures set forth by TSJ and reviewed by City staff are based on the 2019-2020 Proposed Operating Budget, and any Recommended Adjustments to the 2019-2020 Proposed Operating and Capital Budgets that are subject to City Council approval, including contributions from the Convention and Cultural Affairs Fund and Transient Occupancy Tax Fund to the Convention and Visitor's Bureau.

Convention industry business is forecasted to be strong again in 2019-2020; however, revenues are projected to be slightly lower than the current fiscal year, with Gross Operating Results forecasted to be slightly higher. Lower revenue is projected for 2019-2020, relative to 2018-2019 year-end estimates, due to the loss of a large weekend corporate group. Although TSJ anticipates replacement of this booking, revenue potential is comparatively limited. Visitor spending is also projected to drop due, in part, to the one-time impacts of several large-scale sporting events occurring during 2018-2019 - the College Football Playoff Championship and NHL All-Star Weekend.

Performance measure targets are collaboratively developed by TSJ and City staff and reviewed and approved by the TSJ Board of Directors, consistent with past practice. Although the performance measure targets presented in this memorandum reflect this collaboration, TSJ Board of Directors review is pending and anticipated at its next scheduled meeting in July 2019. Additionally, the forthcoming construction of the Museum Place development presents logistical challenges for access to the San José Civic Auditorium (Civic), and the City and TSJ are actively working together to address the impacts of this project to programming for the Civic. Staff may bring forward amendments to these performance targets and budgeted operating assistance for 2019-2020 to account for any significant negative impacts to the operational capacity at the

Civic. Any potential changes brought forward would have the support of both City staff, and the approval of TSJ's Board of Directors.
